## Globe Travellers Stop in Milton Have Visited Over 30 Countries

Two energetic young men in search of countries to settle down in, found their countries, achieved their goal and are having a very enjoyable time, as they tour the globe at the expense of a Swedish automobile manufacturer. The young men, Nigel Kirton of London, England and Carl Petersens of Malm, Sweden, stopped off in Milton for a few minutes on recently to talk to Jim Andrews, the assistant county clerk. Nigel and Jim used to race cars together in Great Britain.

On April 9, 1962, the two adventurers set out from Southern Sweden in a compact Swedish automobile. Since that time they have travelled through Denmark, Germany, Austria, Italy, Yugoslavia, Greece, Turkey, Persia, Pakistan, Kashmir, India, Ceylon, Australia, Singapore, Malaya, New Zealand, Panama via Tahiti, all the South American countries with the exception of Bolivia, Panama, Nicaragua, Honduras, Salvador, Guatemala, Mexico, the U.S.A. and Canada. After driving more than 50,000 miles in their

car and touring all these countries and spots, the young men will return to England on August 31.

**Likes Australia**  
During their trip, Nigel decided in Australia and he plans to head back to the land of the Kangaroo sometime within the next two years. Carl hopes to make his home in New Zealand.

Although each of the countries they visited had many special merits, Nigel believed that Ceylon was probably the prettiest. In comparing Western Canada with

Eastern Canada, Nigel suggested that the people of Eastern Canada are much more friendly. They made the trip from Edmonton to Milton in only three and one half days, a distance of 2,160. As a farmer, Nigel found that there was always something of interest throughout the journey. Carl agreed, but suggested that he has started to get bored with "doing nothing."

During the trip they gave lectures and wrote articles for newspapers and mechanical magazines. On their return to Sweden they will give student lectures.

## Unemployment Down From Previous Year

Unemployment figures for June 1964 decreased some four per cent over the previous year, while the number of persons placed in jobs increased some 14 per cent according to reports received from Miss E. L. Hartwell, manager of the Oakville office of the National Employment Service.

Despite the close proximity of vacation shut-downs, the need for skilled workers has been high and is still a pressing problem. Die setters, auto and truck mechanics, stationary engineers and machinists are occupations where demand exceeds supply.

Secretaries, waitresses and domestics continue to be in short supply, but temporary layoffs are helping to ease the situation.

In June, temporary jobs in berry picking and lawn mowing were mainly filled by high school students, but full-time unskilled work for more mature males was practically non-existent.

Area construction workers are being steadily employed, both union and non-union, and fine weather has been of considerable help in this field.
