Premier Breeder, Exhibitor Titles C.N.E. Wins for Aberfeldy Farms

In a particularly strong showing of Shorthorns at the C.N.E., the herd of R. W. Gardhouse, Milton, staged a powerful display. The herd garnered the Premier Breeder and Premier Exhibitor Banners, as well as both grand champions. Their white senior yearling bull, Aberfeldy Exchequer, went to the top position, as had his paternal brother, Aberfeldy Deacon, in last year's show. The female grand was the Gardhouse senior yearling female, Aberfeldy Waterloo Betty. It is interesting to note that both of these champions were the youngest animals in their respective classes.

The Gardhouse senior bull calf, Aberfeldy Fearless, was named reserve junior champion. In the female junior classes, Gardhouse had junior champion with Aberfeldy Roan Lady 12th, and reserve with Aberfeldy Roan Lady 11th. The groups, get of sire, breeder's herd, and trio of calves, were also Gardhouse wins.

Runner-Up

Providing strong competition, and runner up for Premier Breeder and Premier Exhibitor, was the Scotsdale herd of S. G. Bennett, Georgetown. Their spring yearling bull, Scotsdale Ultimus, by a former grand champion, Scotsdale Navarre, was named junior and reserve grand champion bull. Their winning mature bull, Scotsdale Sterling, by the same sire, was made reserve senior champion. Bennett entries also drew a red ribbon for the first prize aged cow.

Moffat Entries

Campbell Farms, Moffat, moved into the championship circle with their winning two year old polled female, Brecks Zoe. She went on to the reserve senior

and reserve grand championship. The Hendersdale herd of Henry Hendersdale, Milton, provided the third prize junior bull calf and the fourth place summer yearling female. This strong show was judged by internationally known Shorthorn breeder, Clarence Worden, Windsor, N.Y.

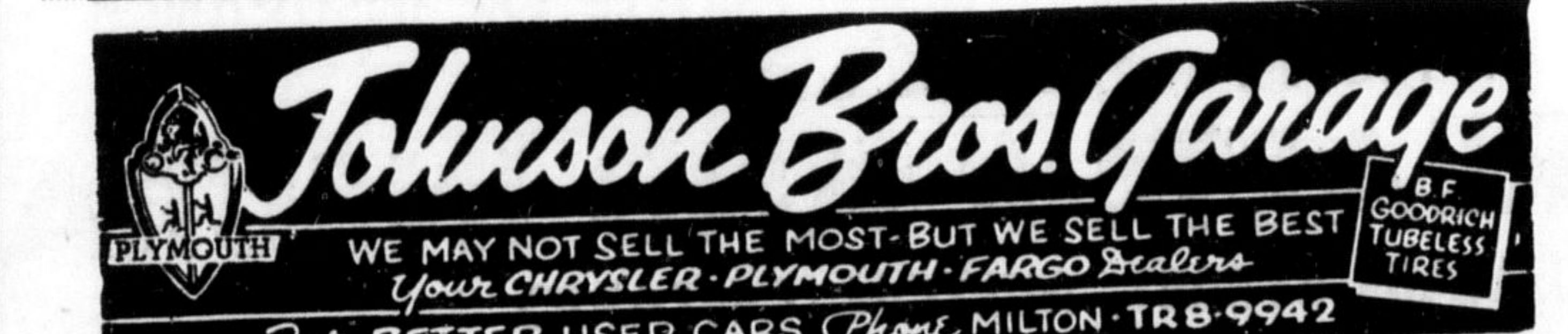
