## School for Deaf Operating at Capacity

The Ontario School for the deaf at Milton will be operating either at capacity or close to it when the fall term begins next week, superintendent D. E. Kennedy announced today.

Enrolment is expected to be 204, but may rise to the capacity of 210, he said. There were 163 pupils at the residential school last year.

Most of the new students will be beginners, aged from five years and three months up. However a few are transfers and they will come to live at Milton school from Belleville, Montreal, Toronto, Buffalo and as far away as Edmonton.

**Open 25th Room**  
 Twenty four of the school's 25 classrooms will be in operation, an increase of five over last year. Mr. Kennedy said it may be necessary to use the 25th classroom as well, if enrolment goes over the 204.

The children will live in seven 30-bed dormitories, meaning the entire junior residence will be occupied.

Two changes have been made in senior personnel at the school this year. John Boyd, who was assistant superintendent for the past year at O.S.D. Milton, has transferred to the Special Services Branch of the Ontario Department of Education, to work as an inspector. He is temporarily on leave of absence to complete work on his Ph. D. at North Western University, prior to accepting the new position with the Department. Mr. Boyd was audiologist services advisor with the Belleville School for the Deaf, before coming to Milton a year ago as assistant superintendent.

**Dean of Residence**  
 A new position at O.S.D. is being filled this year by Wayne Fox. He will be Dean of Residence and Guidance Counsellor for the students. An experienced teacher of the deaf, he has been training for the position for the past two years at O.S.D. Belleville. Prior to that he was in charge of physical education at Belleville for several years. Mr. Fox is married to a Belleville graduate and has three daughters.

To date, all but one of the 25 teachers has been engaged for the 1964-65 school term. New to the staff are Victor Heaps of Oakville, who will live on Barton St., and who has trained at O.S.D. Belleville; Miss Joan McPhie of Peterboro, Miss Mary Foster of Toronto, and Miss Barbara Jennings of Hamilton, all of whom were trained in Belleville; Mrs. Eleanor Hilson of Milton, who has several years of experience teaching in elementary schools

and who has trained at O.S.D. Milton; Mrs. Carol Kerr of Milton, who supplied at O.S.D. last year, and who was trained at the Milton school; and Mrs. Ann Wilner of Toronto, who has taught pre-school deaf children at Hamilton, and who trained at the Central Institute for the Deaf, St. Louis.

**Two Leave O.S.D.**  
 Two of last year's teachers have left the staff — Mrs. Lynn Burnham who moved to the Maritimes; and Clayton Morrison who joined the Toronto secondary school staff to teach a class of deaf high school students.

Returning as supervising teacher is Mrs. R. Driscoll (the former Miss Winn Maloney) who was married during the summer months.

Miss Fox is in charge of the home visiting service operated by O.S.D., and will conduct weekly clinics for pre-school deaf children at the school.
