Fire destruction in Canada's forests to the end of July greatly exceeded the losses recorded for the corresponding period last

Forest areas burned were estimated at 1,586,000 acres at the end of July, as a result of 5,526 fires, according to statistics released by the federal Department Forestry. At the same date last year, 368,000 acres of forest land had been damaged in 5,197

June - estimated areas burned, 266,000 acres in 1,295 fires, including 32,000 acres in 49 fires in the Yukon and Northwest.
