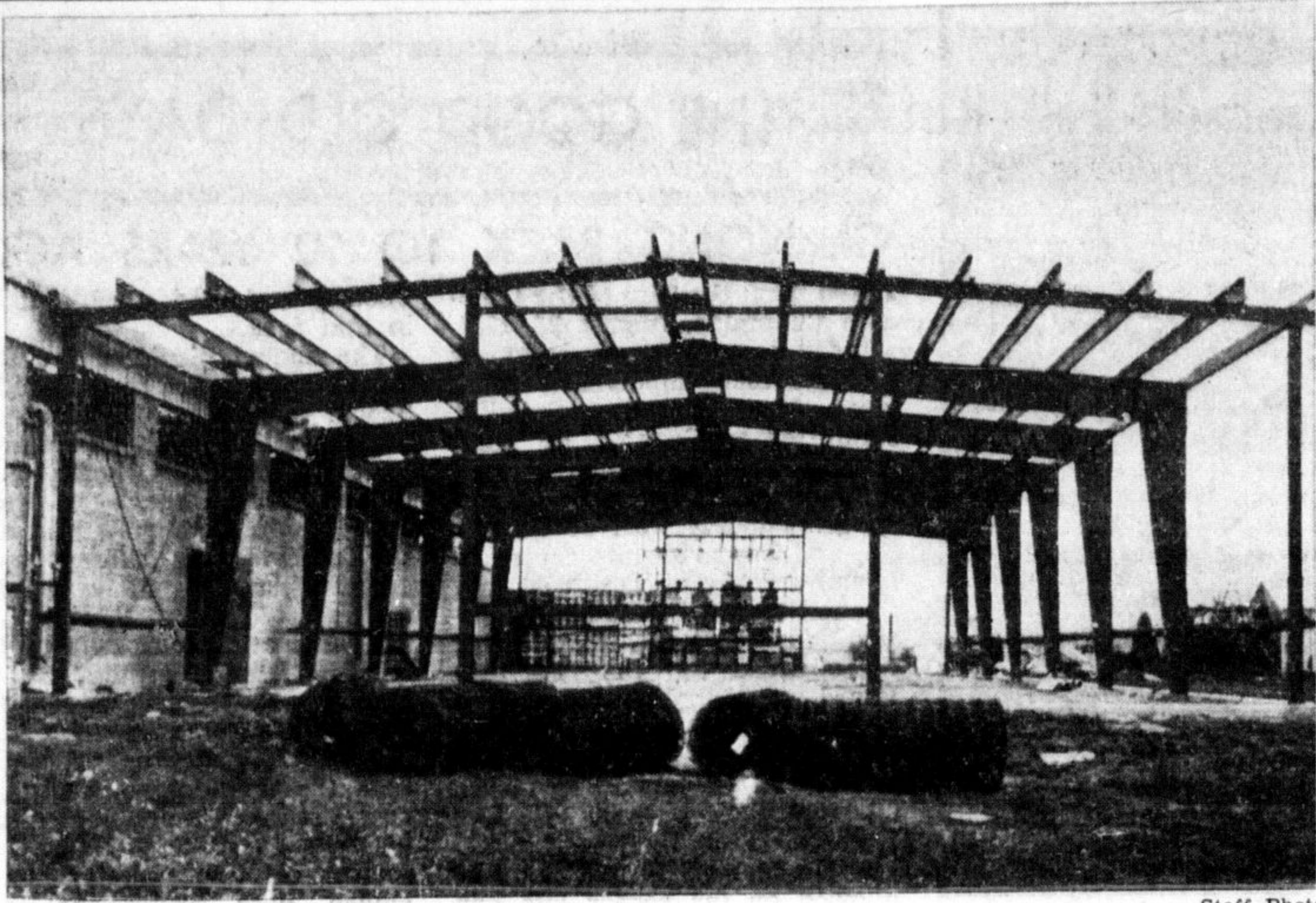

A \$45,000 ADDITION to the Canadian Meter Company, Milton plant, is now under construction and will be ready for operation by the end of September. It will be a Siron-Steel metal clad building with panels to harmonize with the existing cement block structure. The new 50 foot by 170 foot addition will serve as a warehouse to store partially manufactured materials. It will not alter the employment level of the Milton plant immediately although increased production capacity would result in a long range program.

TYPES OF N.H.A. LOANS
The National Housing Act provides for loans by approved lenders. These are private companies such as chartered banks, life insurance companies and trust and loan companies authorized by the federal governments to lend under the terms of the Act. A list of the approved lenders is available from any office of Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation.
If approved lenders are not making loans in the area in

which you wish to build, you may then apply directly to C.M.H.C. for a loan. In this case, federal government funds are used for the loan.
Before C.M.H.C. can consider making a direct loan, you must have tried to obtain an N.H.A. loan from at least two private lending companies. In smaller centres and rural areas, where lending by the private companies may be limited, such evidence is required from only one company.
