Suggests Clean-Up Of Parkway Field

Dudley Ervin, Parkway Drive, appeared before Milton Council last week with a list of suggestions for cleaning up a vacant area of town land west of the present end of his street. He suggested the roadsides were piled high with junk dumped there by trucks, some trees felled by a nearby subdivider had been dropped in the field, the weeds were growing high and presenting a fire hazard, and teenagers were using an unfinished piece of roadway there as "a dragstrip". Councilors agreed to consider blocking the road off to stop vehicular traffic, and have the weeds cut by the town weed inspector. The town foreman was to be asked to look at the tree stumps and if the blame lies with the subdivider, have the builder remove them. Parkway neighbor Bill Sanders, who appeared with Mr. Ervin, asked about getting some trees planted at the front of his property. It was suggested he should wait for the council's fall co-operative tree planting program through which ratepayers can buy trees at half price.
