Night School Invites Registration

Milton Night School is off to an encouraging start, president Mrs. D. Downs reported this week. To date most of the teachers have been arranged for, new courses have been added to those already offered, and some students have already applied to enroll in a course. Sponsors are the Milton Advisory Committee on Adult Education, and the High School Board.

The group offers 11 courses of 16 two-hour lessons each, which

run from October 27 to December 15 and from January 5 to February 23. Fee is \$7 per course. There are also 13 courses consisting of eight two-hour lessons, one before Christmas and one

after the holiday. Applicants can enroll for two separate eight-week courses if they wish, and the fee for each course is \$4. Deadline for applicants is October 5 and an application form is found elsewhere in this issue.

Courses Include
The 16-week courses include conversational French, woodwork, bookkeeping, drafting, elementary electronics and electricity, elementary machine shop, beginners' art, advanced art, beginners' typing and intermediate typing.

The eight-week courses are rug making, St. John Ambulance first aid, textile and tile decorating, tailoring, elementary sewing and children's clothing, advanced sewing, millinery, floriculture, smoking, leather, hostess, pastels (water colors), and copper enamelling.

lot more hills." Scottish dancing is recognized as one of the most strenuous and difficult forms of dancing, and during his tour Kirk performed four types of highland dancing, plus the sailors' hornpipe and the Irish jig.

Kirk's father Harvey Brush, reports that his son probably gained his interest in highland dancing from watching him play the bagpipes. Mr. Brush is a member of the Lorne Scots Pipe Band and also performs at many special events. After Kirk's initial interest was gained, it took many hours of hard work before he was ready to travel to Scotland. On the average it is estimated Kirk practices an hour every day except on Sunday when he takes a rest.

For the past two and a half years, he has been attending dancing competitions nearly every week during the months of June to September. Kirk travels with his family to the competitions and they have been to Montreal several times, to Caledon, Syracuse New York, Detroit, Embro, Pittsburg and Guelph as well as many other smaller centres. Mr. Brush estimated, "you can wear out a car a year by travelling to the competitions."

All the travelling the Brush family has endured however, has not been for nought, as Kirk has piled up an impressive number of medals, certificates and trophies. Heading his prize list, he considers, are his Ontario Championships in 1962 and 1963, his first place trophy from Ladentown New York in 1963 and his first place trophy from Pittsburg in 1964. However, his victories in Scotland rank as his greatest triumphs to date.

Since victories in Scotland are the ultimate aim of all Scottish dancers, Kirk is anxious to return to the land of the heather and once again pit his skills against the greatest highland dancers in the world. His teacher and parents report it is quite possible that Kirk will travel to Scotland again within the next three years, and already he's priming himself for that next big challenge.
