Funerals Fill Need Says Rotary Speaker

Pointing up the logic of present day funerals, Willis Ruscoe, manager of the Canadian Embalmers Supply Co. told members of the Rotary Club of Milton, today's funerals fill an emotional need in the living and permit those who are left to pay their final tribute.

He suggested, in his address to Rotarians last week, the present day funeral better equips relatives and friends to absorb their grief.

Discussing the cost of funerals, he noted the average cost of an adult funeral in Ontario is \$574 and this covers funerals that range from \$200 to over \$2,000. The price on a casket includes countless other services as well as the casket, he emphasized, including such things as preparation for burial, notices, cemetery arrangements and a multitude of other things including the use of a funeral home.

Embalming includes disinfecting, preserving and cosmetology, the speaker explained as he emphasized the need for each. "Embalming makes sense and serves a useful purpose," Mr. Ruscoe concluded.
