**Inspiring Religious Service
Traces Origin of our Hymns**

A very inspiring little religious service that was outstanding in its earnestness and sincerity was held in the auditorium on Saturday night November 7. It was the occasion of the visit of 18 ladies and gentlemen and young people who are members of the Seventh Day Adventist Church in Oakville. These visitors are known as the Sunshine Band and they visit hospitals and homes like Halton Manor in order to sing for the residents. W. H. Egan was in charge of the service and Mrs. Y. Hunter was the accompanist. Mr. Egan is the head deacon of the church.

After a few introductory remarks by Mr. Egan, the program began. Led by Mr. Egan, the visitors and audience sang Abide with me and Rock of Ages in unison. This was followed by a fine solo, My Heavenly Father Watches Over Me sung by Mrs. L. Blanchard.

The greatest part of the program was given over to the narration of stories that explained how certain familiar hymns came to be written. The stories were followed by the singing of these hymns as solos, duets or trios by the visitors or in unison by the visitors and the audience. Two of these hymns were What a Friend We Have in Jesus and Bless Be the Tie That Binds. The former was written by John Scriven, an Irish-Canadian after he had arrived in Canada from Ireland. It was intended to comfort his mother back home in Ireland. Bless Be the Tie was written by John Fawcett who was a Baptist minister in England. He wrote this hymn when he was leaving one of the churches where he had been minister.

D. Hunter gave a reading, Sunset Vespers, the content of which included some lovely poems. This reading was illustrated by the singing of a trio, Have Thine Own Way, Lord and a duet, God's Way is the Best Way.

The service ended with an eloquent closing prayer by Mr. Egan.

A church service, part of which was dedicated to Remembrance Day Sunday was conducted on Sunday afternoon, November 8 by Rev. J. K. L. McGown. Mrs. S. Lockie was the organist.

Before beginning his sermon, Mr. McGown read the poem In Flanders Fields and asked the congregation to spend a few minutes in silent prayer in remembrance of those who gave their lives in war.

Mr. McGown's sermon was based on words to be found in verse 6 of Chapter 4 of Zechariah. These words are: "Not by might nor by power, but by spirit," saith the Lord of hosts.

Mr. McGown began his sermon

by narrating the biography of John Wesley, the founder of the Methodist Church. This included Wesley's practice of holding open-air services. As a result of Wesley's influence Robert Raiker established Sunday schools, John Howard brought about prison reform and William Wilberforce succeeded in having the slave trade abolished in British possessions.

This power of the Spirit, ex-

embodied in the work of John Wesley and those influenced, is needed in the world of today. It can be applied to modern problems, such as the breaking down of racial barriers.

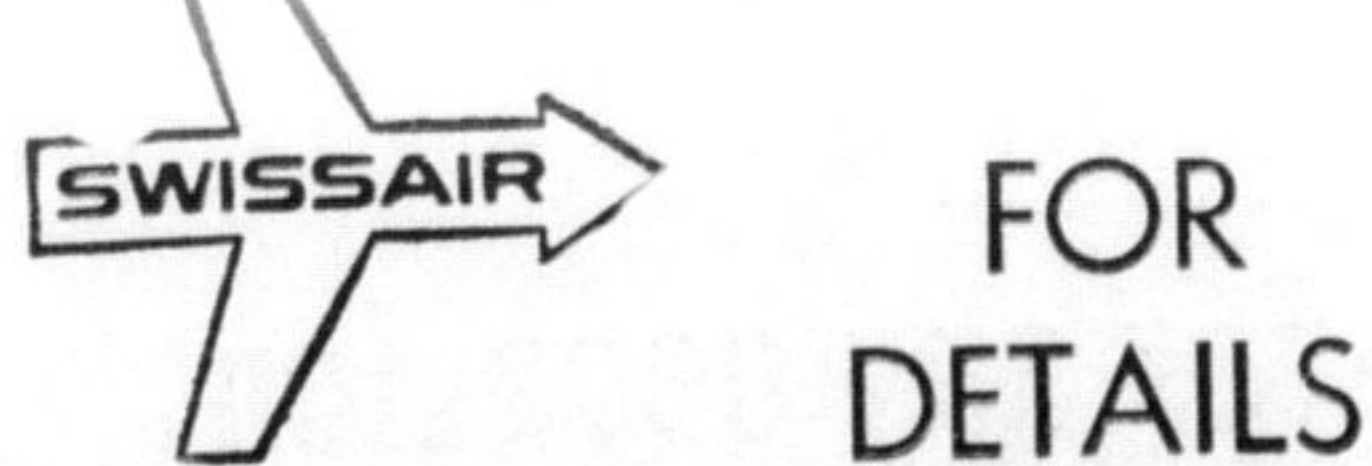

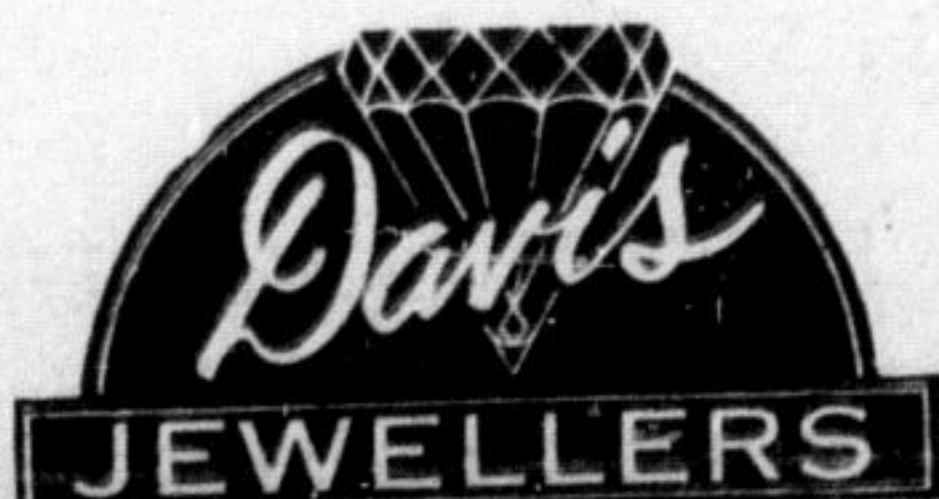
