MILTON'S CHANGING MAIN STREET is constantly being modernized and one of the current changes taking place is the renovations at the Bank of Nova Scotia building. The top floor of the present bank is being knocked down, and the former Milton Fabric Centre store at the right has been demolished. The bank will be expanded to cover the area formerly used by both stores, and will feature white concrete columns and floor-to-ceiling glass windows across the front. The bank originally opened there as the Metropolitan Bank in 1903 and was taken over by Bank of Nova Scotia in 1914.




