A new page in the history of the Lorne Scots (Peel, Dufferin and Halton regiment) began on Sunday when Lt. Col. E. F. Conover, C.D., relinquished his command as commanding officer and Lt. Col. R. G. Hardie, C.D., assumed command of the Regiment.

The change of command ceremony took place on Sunday afternoon in the sports hall at the

Scots (militia) in April 1951 and during the recent years he served as Adjutant, Training Officer and Commanding Officer of "A" Coy located in Lakeview. In October of 1961 he was promoted to Second-in-Command. In addition to his duties as Second-in-Command, he also served as Aide de Camp to Lt. Gov. Keiller McKay and Lt. Gov. Earl Rowe.

Lt. Col. R. G. Hardie lives in Islington with his wife Mary and their three children, Jim 19, Cathy 17, and Peter 12.

Pallett, C.D., of Cooksville; Maj. R. J. Honey, C.D., of Brampton; Capt. A. G. Descelles, C.D., of Clarkson; Capt. W. B. Patterson, C.D., of Brampton; Capt. W. E. Doole, of Brampton; Capt. R. E. Seltzer, of Thornhill; Capt. G. R. Carruthers, of Toronto; Capt. A. E. McIntosh, of Georgetown; C.S.M. (W02) William Collier, C.D., of Georgetown; S/Sgt. William Hamilton, C.D., of Orangeville; S/Sgt. Horace Page, C.D., of Brampton. These officers and Non-Commissioned Officers have a combined service of 200 years service in the armed forces.

Hamilton are the last remaining members of the Peel and Dufferin Regiment and CSM (W02) Collier is the last remaining member of the Halton Rifles, which later became the Lorne Rifles (Scottish). Lt. Col. R. G. Hardie, a member of the Lorne Scots since 1938, is a veteran of the Second World War. He went overseas with the regiment in 1941 and returned to Canada as a sergeant in 1943 to receive his officer training and was commissioned. He returned to England in late 1943 and was transferred to the Essex Scottish with whom he saw action in North-West Europe as part of the 2nd Canadian Division. Lt. Col. Hardie was severely wounded overseas and invalided home in 1944, after a year in hospitals, he was discharged in 1945.


