Waste Dumped by Creeks

Call for Provincial Licensing

A motion calling for provincial licensing of waste disposal businesses was approved last week by members of the Halton Region Conservation Authority. An East Flamboro resident pointed out in a letter that one industrial firm's waste was being dumped into tanks beside a creek near the man's home, and stream goes down to our swimming area at Carlisle. Authority member Azel Bates said East Flamboro township council plans to stop the situation, as the other authority members reported they had heard of a similar disposal system near Moffat that might pollute a stream. The complainant, in his letter, suggested it might be a steel mill or refinery that was dumping the waste near his home. Besides the possibility of stream pollution, he claimed the waste had a "foul odor".

To Swimming Area
 "If this (East Flamboro situation) is creating pollution, we are quite concerned," suggested field officer Dave Murray, "that dumping is illegal without a permit and one has not been issued. George Currie of Esquesing said three or four similar dumps were stopped in that township. "If it doesn't go into our creeks, it is going into the ground water and we don't know where it could go from there," added member George Atkins, Bronte. Burlington representative Lyall Fox called for a provincial licensing scheme, noting the situation exists all across Ontario. His motion asking the provincial department to investigate licensing was approved.

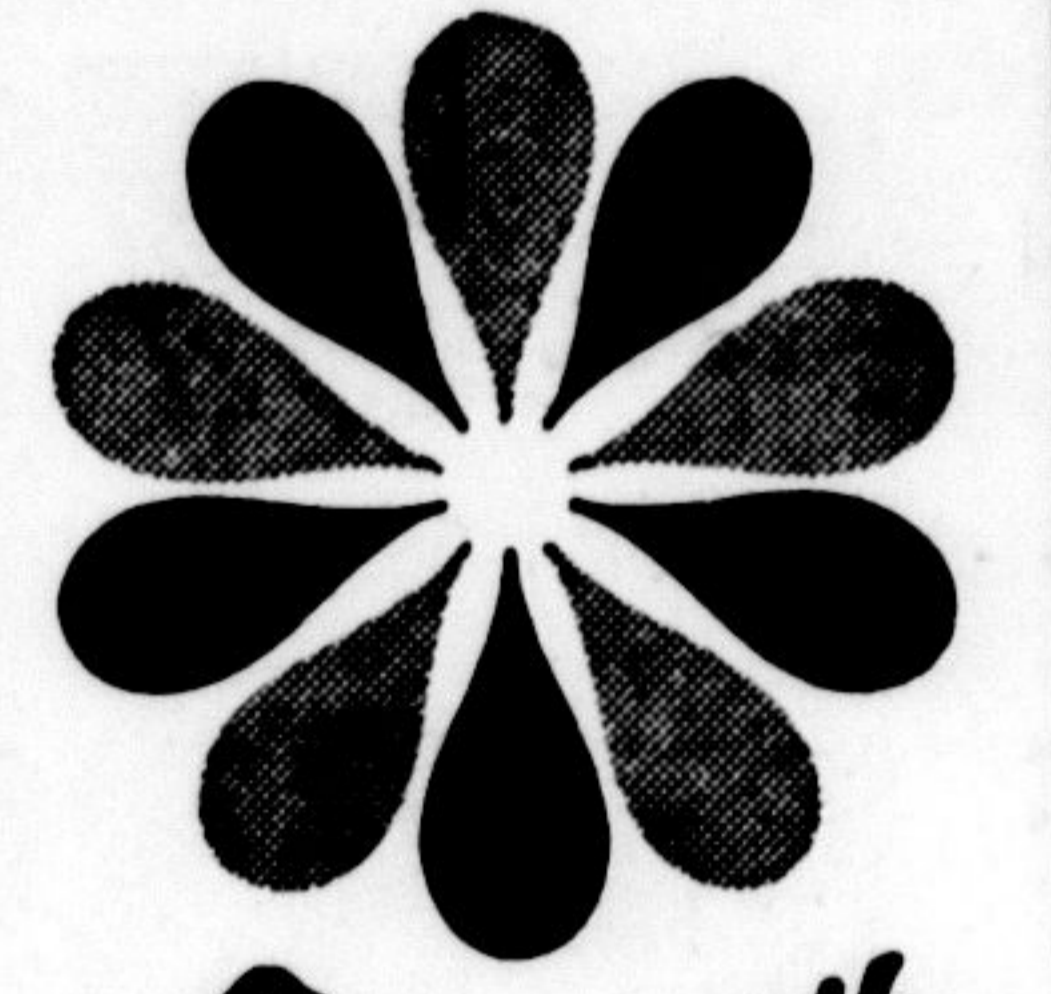
