

HARLEY...to HALTON

The House of Commons has recessed for the Easter holidays. During the past week debate has taken place on the Throne Speech which means that the topics discussed can cover any subject. We have, therefore, seen the debate range from the situation in Viet Nam to discussion of the St. Lawrence Seaway and almost everything and anything imaginable. I had hoped to participate in the debate but unfortunately time ran out before my turn came up.

The Throne Speech will go down in history as being one of the farthest-reaching policy declarations in our history. There are many matters which will involve and touch every Canadian. All of these matters, of course, will be fully debated later and I will discuss these in detail as these matters come before Parliament.

The Special Committee on Food and Drugs is to be reconstituted to consider the measures necessary to reduce the cost of drugs. The Committee is to be assisted by the Government which I have interpreted to mean that the Committee will be able to hire personnel to conduct re-

search and will probably as well hire legal counsel.

I am sure that all of the residents of Halton will be pleased with the Honourable Walter Gordon's Budget Paper. The 1964 books have been officially added up and show a deficit of \$83 million dollars rather than the formerly anticipated \$400 million deficit. The 1963 deficit was \$619 million. As a matter of fact, if we were to take off the surplus in the Old Age Pension Fund then the practical deficit in only \$19 million, of course, our Gross National Product rose almost 9% — the biggest gain since 1956. Revenues rose 14%, while expenditures rose 5%, which explains the improvement in our deficit picture.

The prospects for 1965 are good. It is hoped that in keeping with our prosperity, the Budget which will be brought down on 26th April, on our return to Ottawa, will reveal tax cuts in both personal and corporate income tax. The Budget is always introduced at 8:00 p.m., after the close of the stock market so that any changes in the Budget are known at a time when market trading and activity is nil.
