Suggested floor plans prepared by architect Clare Maclean will completely change the interior appearance of the building, which was constructed in 1865, seven years after Milton was incorporated as a town and designated as the County Town of Halton Coun-

According to the architect's plans, the first floor of the renovated building would house a general office, a private office for the town manager, a private office and reception office for the town assessor, two machine rooms which allow for future expansion and the relocation of the Milton Police Department in the back portion of the building where the Milton Planning Board and Cancer Society presently have quar-

The town forman's office now located on the first floor, would be moved into the basement where the Milton Public Library was located until last year.
