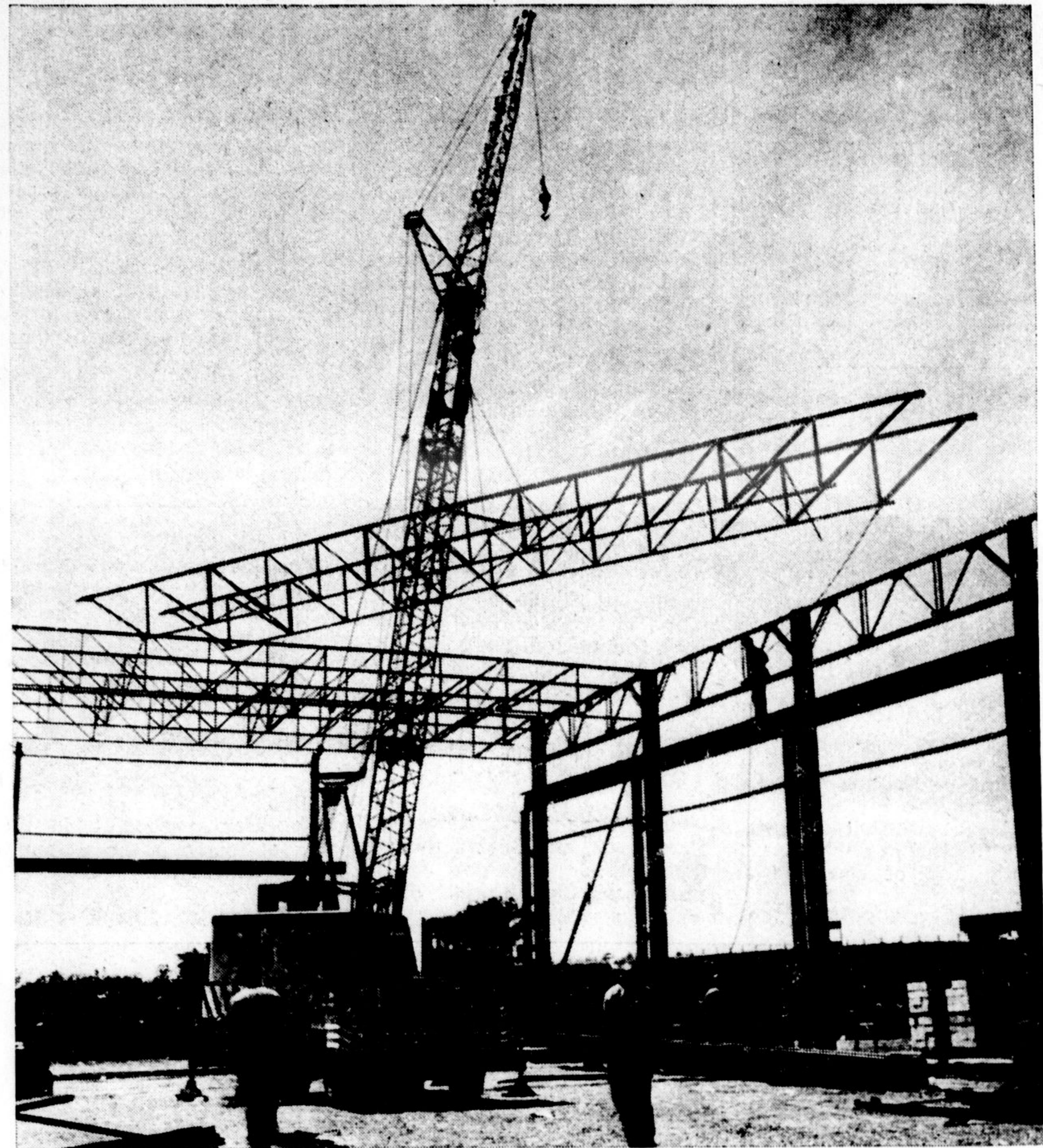
Mrs. Gervais thanked Mrs. Gillmour for the very interesting and informative talk and film.

GRENFELL STAMP

A special new postage stamp to honor the centenary of the birth of Sir Wilfred Grenfell, author and medical missionary to Newfoundland and Labrador, will be issued June 9 by the Canada Post Office, local Postmaster Walter Bell reports. Sir Wilfred brought a hospital ship to Labrador in 1892 and devoted the rest of his life to the welfare of its inhabitants.

A "Save a Life" campaign is being carried out in Milton by the Acton branch of the St. John Ambulance Brigade.

"Canada has the highest death rate by drowning of any country in the world. We want to lower that rate," says S. Callard of the brigade.

The Brigade is offering free two-hour classes on two different methods of artificial respiration to anyone interested. Classes are offered to single persons as well as groups.

The motto of the course is "Two hours today may save a life tomorrow". The courses will be offered as long as people show interest.
