Award Contract Burlington Dock

A \$279,952 contract for the first stage of harbor repairs at Burlington Channel, has been awarded to Bermingham Construction Limited of Hamilton, it was announced today by Public Works Minister Lucien Cardin.

The firm submitted the lowest of seven tenders opened May 12. Highest bid was \$431,036.50.

Work involves reconstruction of the east part of the south pier. This includes refacing 930 feet of the south pier with steel sheet piling, placing crushed-stone fill betwen the new and existing work, pouring a new concrete deck over the existing concrete surface for a distance of 1,149 feet and a width varying between 25 feet and 50 feet, installation of services along the new facewall and dredging a channel in front of the new facewall to a depth of 30

The work is considered essential to permit full use of the harbor by seaway-draft shipping. It is scheduled for completion in six months.


