

The number of hay fevr victims has been variously estimated at from 2% to 10% of the population, even at the lower figure, a sizeable segment of our society. Those fortunate enough seek refuge in the northern resort areas during the season, and touroid otherwise attractive accomodation in the southern part of the

In order to eradicate ragweed from this southern area (roughly south of North Bay) municipalities, organizations, and individuals are employing modern methods, machinery and chemicals. Ragweed-conscious groups of citizens are providing leadership and encouragement, and legislation in respect to ragweed is being more ridgidly enforced. This campaign merits the active support of every citizen and every governing body.
