COUNTY OF HALTON WEED CONTROL NEWS

COMMON RAGWEED

AMBROSIA ARTEMISIFOLIA
This annual weed has no valid claim to beauty either in infancy or in maturity. No bright colors in the flowers, no soft or vivid greens in foliage compensate for the unpleasantness caused by this plant.

Inconspicuous in the seedling stage, it rapidly develops finely divided ragged leaves, dull dark green on top, dull pale green on the under surface. It grows from one to three feet high, with numerous spikes, the pollen producing flowers, at the top of the plant. The pollen is a greenish yellow and is produced in unnecessarily generous quantities. Seeds are borne at the base of the spikes, dark brown, top shaded. Seeds remain viable in the soil for many years, germinate when brought to the surface or when shelter from other plants is reduced.

Not a Serious Problem

Ragweed is no longer a serious problem in crop production, according to the Field Crops Branch, Ontario Department of Agriculture. It does not survive 2,4-D, 2,4-DB, atrazine, or in fact any of the chemical and cultural practices of today's agriculture. It does not survive a good, close turf in lawn, park or pasture. But it does survive in a wide area of semi-neglected lands; run-down meadows, worn out pastures.

In order to eradicate ragweed from this southern area (roughly south of North Bay) municipalities, organizations, and individuals are employing modern methods, machinery and chemicals. Ragweed-conscious groups of citizens are providing leadership and encouragement, and legislation in respect to ragweed is being more rigidly enforced. This campaign merits the active support of every citizen and every governing body.
