

# Hamilton Leads Series Hit Campbellville 5-4

Hamilton took a one-game lead in their best-of-five series for the Halton championship when they defeated Campbellville by a 5-4 score in Campbellville, Friday night.

Madden in relief of Anderson was the winning pitcher and the veteran Campbellville southpaw Jack Roberts, who went all the way, was the loser. Madden in seven and two-thirds innings shut the defending champions out on four hits. He struck out seven and walked four. Anderson, his predecessor, gave up four runs in one and one-third innings on five hits and one walk.

The loss was a heartbreaker for Roberts, who gave up five runs, all unearned, off seven hits. He struck out three and the only walk he allowed was intentional.

**Loses Fly Ball**  
Campbellville jumped into a 4-0 lead in the second inning. Singles by Henderson and Cairns and a walk loaded the bases. The Hamilton right fielder then lost King's fly ball in the lights. It dropped in for a single and Henderson scored. Roberts' single drove in two more and Dredge's single plated another.

In the bottom of the third, Hamilton tied it up on Campbellville miscues. With two out, Henderson erred on Jannuzzi's

grounder and then on Rowe's grounder, threw over first and second on second and third. An intentional pass filled the bases and then Dredge erred on Wilson's grounder, to let in two runs and Holt's single drove in two more.

### Dispute Call

It remained a 4-4 tie until the bottom of the seventh when Madden singled, was sacrificed to second, went to third on an error and scored after a fly to left. Campbellville hotly disputed the run, claiming Madden hadn't tagged up at third and strangely, the run was allowed, even though both umpires admitted that they didn't know whether he had tagged up or no, as they hadn't seen.

Rick Holt led the Hamilton attack with a double and a single. Tanezzi, Rowe, Mendyk, Roberts and Madden all singled. Stan Henderson, Earl Cairns and Jack Roberts all had two hits for Campbellville, while Elmer Dredge, Bill Elliot and Stu King all had one each.

The series will now be held up as both teams have gone into the O.B.A. playdowns.
