Library Notes

Everyone looks forward to taking it easy in the summer, especially boys and girls. Many find their chief delight in curling up in the shade with a good story while mothers find reading a picture book to the small fry one sure way of keeping them quiet on a holiday.

A perennial favorite for all ages to read and to be read to is A. A. Milne's, Winnie the Pooh. There are a few scientifically minded souls who do not appreciate Christopher Robin, Pooh Bear, Eeyore, Piglet and the other animals, but they are in the minority. When the first book comes to an end, the two books of Pooh Corner and The House at Pooh Corner and the two books of Milne's poetry Now We Are Six and When We Were Very Young are in great demand. Equally enchanting to both child and adult is Wind in the Willows.

Another series of books which can be thoroughly enjoyed by boys and girls in grade five and six at the same time give great pleasure as family reading is The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe, Prince Caspian, The Voyage of the Dawn Treader and the Silver Chair, all by C. S. Lewis, who wrote other equally good stories.

There are so many humorous and exciting books to talk about, it is difficult to choose the best. Among these, however, are the

Beverly Cleary books about Henry and Ribsey, fortunately there are quite a number in the series, so if you have a reluctant reader in the family introduce him to Henry and he is sure to come back for more. Another firm favorite is Miss Pickeral, an adventurous lady whose thirst for action takes her through several books to Mars, Under the Sea, to the Arctic not to mention her activities with a geiger counter.

Carolyn Haywood has entertained innumerable children in grade four with the story of Betsy. Since "B" is for Betsy, was published in 1939 there have been many more episodes in her busy life. For boys in this age group whether reluctant, disinterested or good readers, the stories that are a complete success are about Freddy the Pig, by Walter Brooks.

Freddy seems to appeal to a wide age group and the same is true of stories by William Steele. Based on life in Pioneer America they are full of action, adventure—the Indians, Tomahawks and Trouble, Far Frontier and Flaming Arrows are three in this category while the young try find Andy Jackson at the Water Well hilarious.

Summer or winter fairy stories are always popular, but sometimes the very people who enjoy them most find them too difficult

to read. Now the old favorites have been retold by Virginia Haviland, illustrated most attractively by Felix Hoffman and published in large, clear print under the titles Favorite Fairy Tales Told

in Scotland . . . in Poland . . . in Germany etc. With innumerable laughs and adventures awaiting, and long hours in which to enjoy them we hope that the boys and girls will

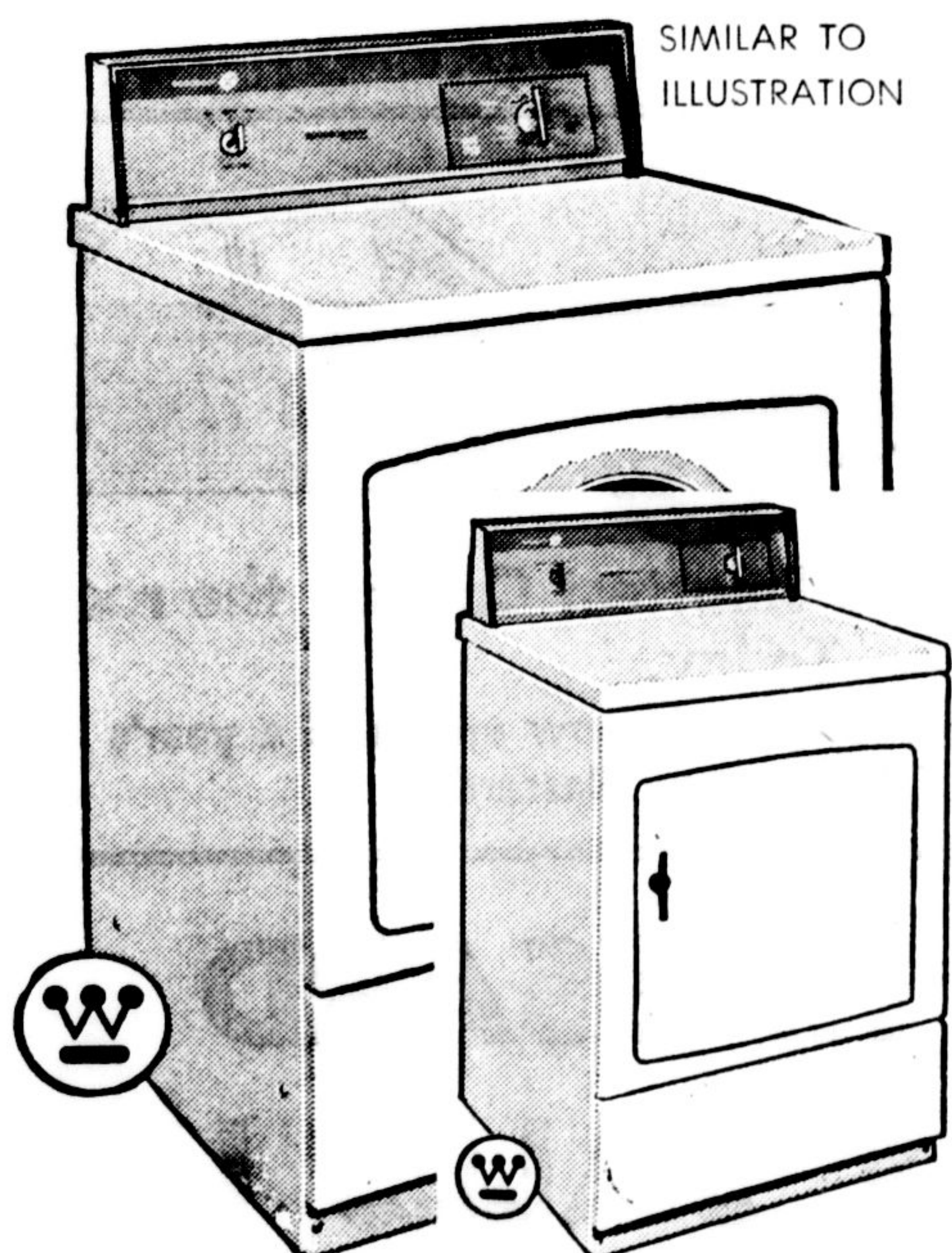

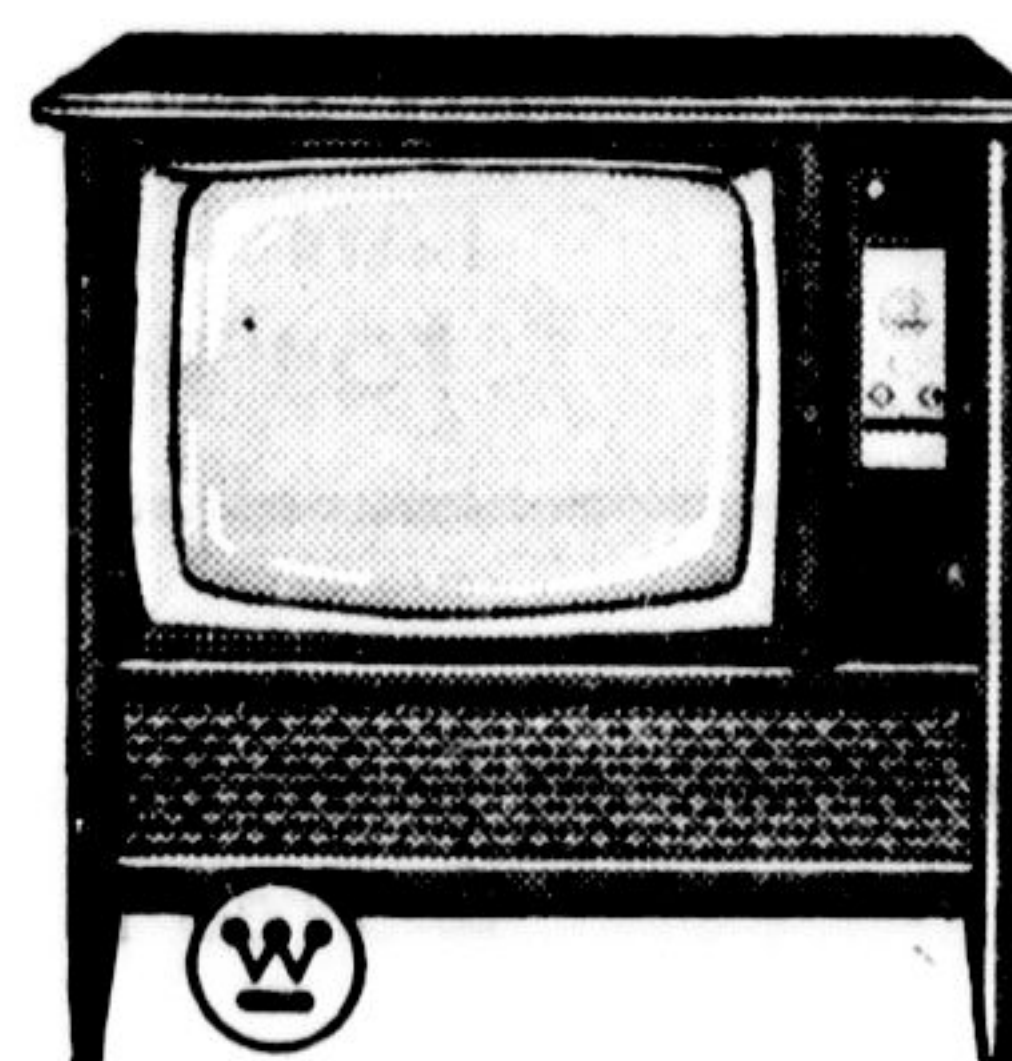
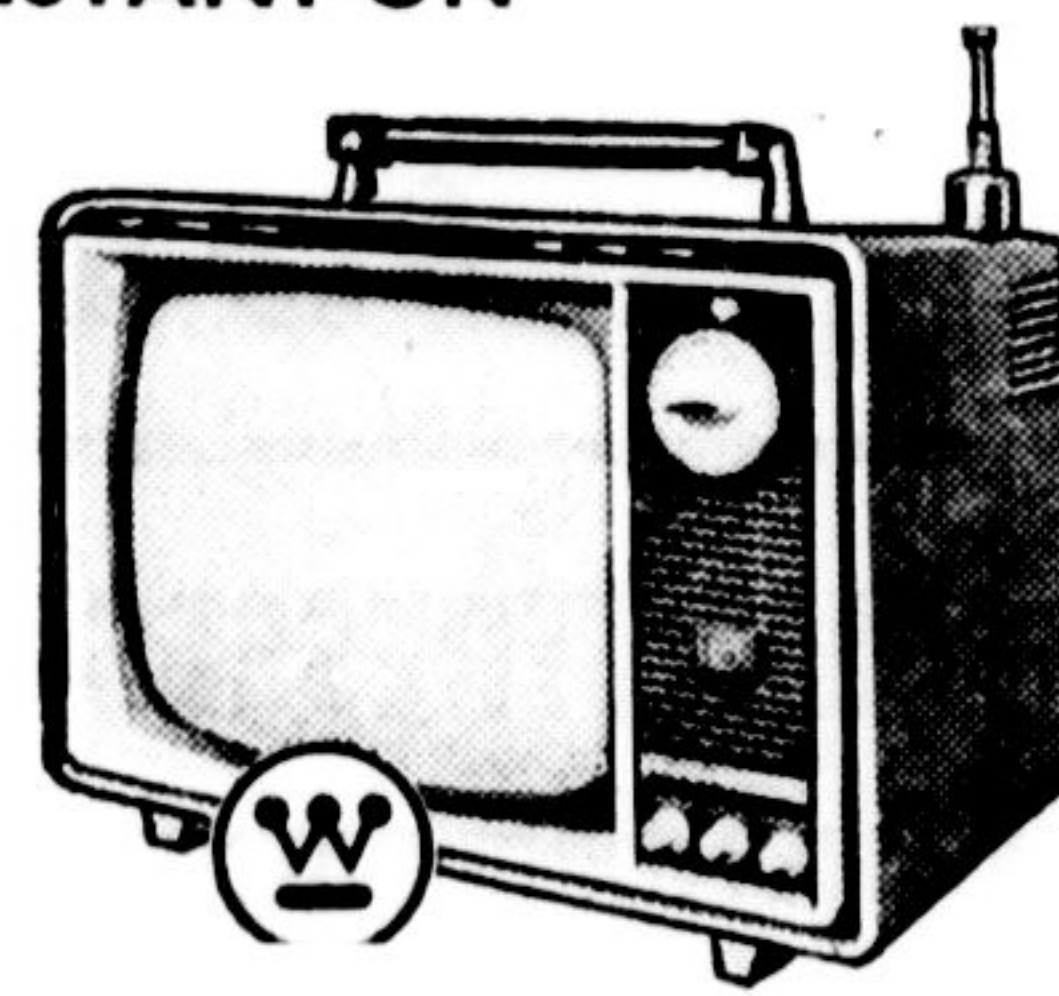
