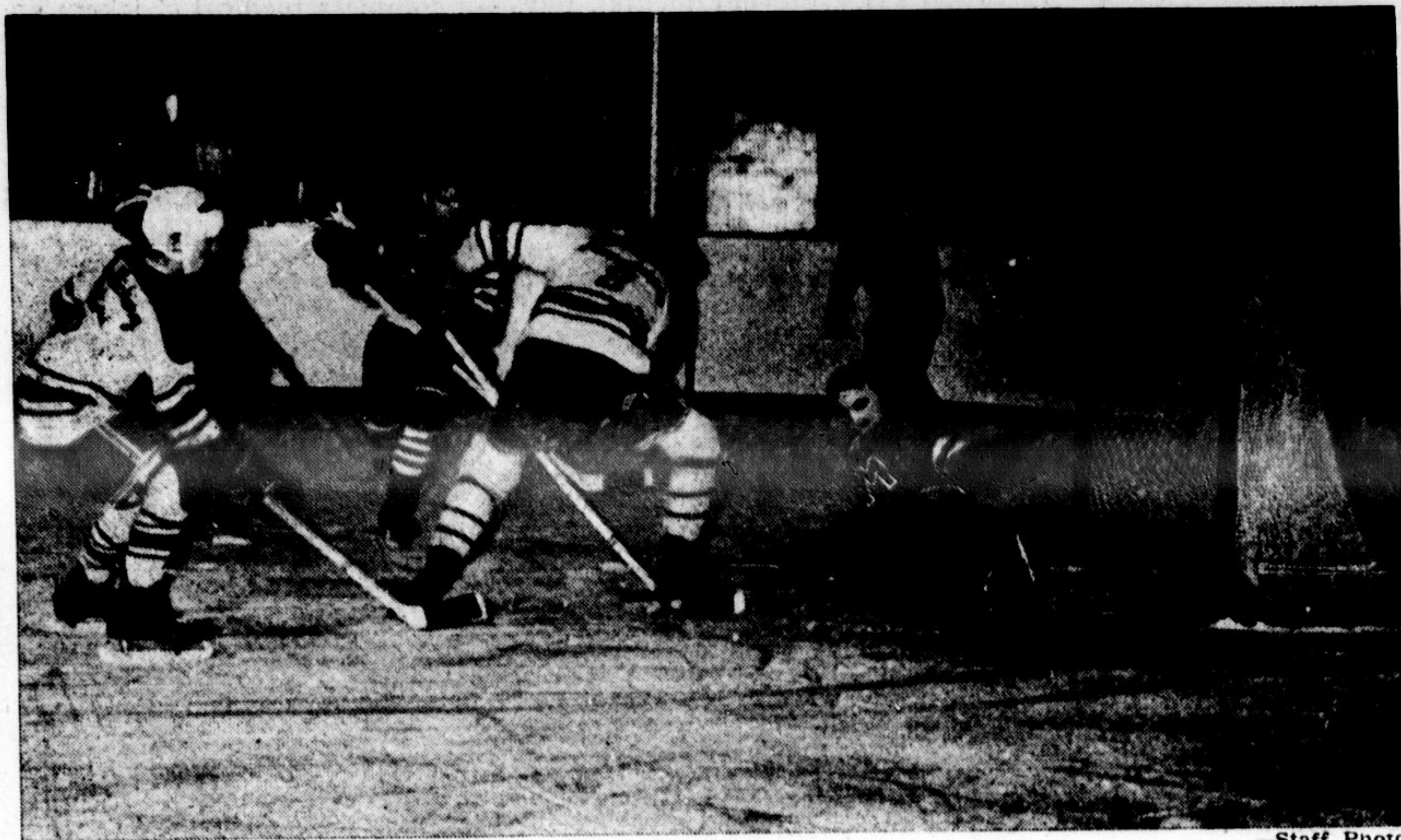


Renovated Arena is Scene of Lots of Activity
