Acton Baptist Church Choir Sings at Saturday Service

Advent Approaching

Dr. Dustan read two Scripture lessons, Psalm 95 and verses 3-8 of chapter 23 of Jeremiah. Dr. Dustan said the Christian church is now approaching the season of Advent, in which preparation is made for Christmas. Jeremiah's words are appropriate in this season because he speaks of the New King, who will be the Messiah. At this time, the Jews were suffering terrible hardships at the

hands of cruel enemies. He promised that the New King would bring unity to these countries. Whenever circumstances cause us despondency, we should remember the words "God loves, God lives and God reigns".
