Art Kemp, Al Ferri Named Area Apple Committee

District 1 which includes Lincoln, Welland, Wentworth, Halton, Peel and York Counties, elected five committee members as follows: Art Kemp, Burlington; Frank Richardson, Mount Hope; Henry Freel, Niagara-on-the-Lake; Al Ferri, Norval; Art Pengilly, Meadowvale. Art Kemp was elected chairman of this group and will serve as representative on the Ontario Apple Producers Marketing Board until August 1966.

The meeting which saw an attendance of 19 growers taking an interest in the affairs of the apple promotion program, had opportunity to ask questions regarding the function of the program over the past season. A financial statement was presented by chairman

Art Kemp, showing an increase from fees of almost \$117,000 for the past year. Of this amount, almost \$80,000 was spent on apple promotion with the remainder being carried over to this year's budget.

It might be noted that the board now has the power to take court action against producers that do not report their sales and make payment of their fees. This is the only way such a plan can work.

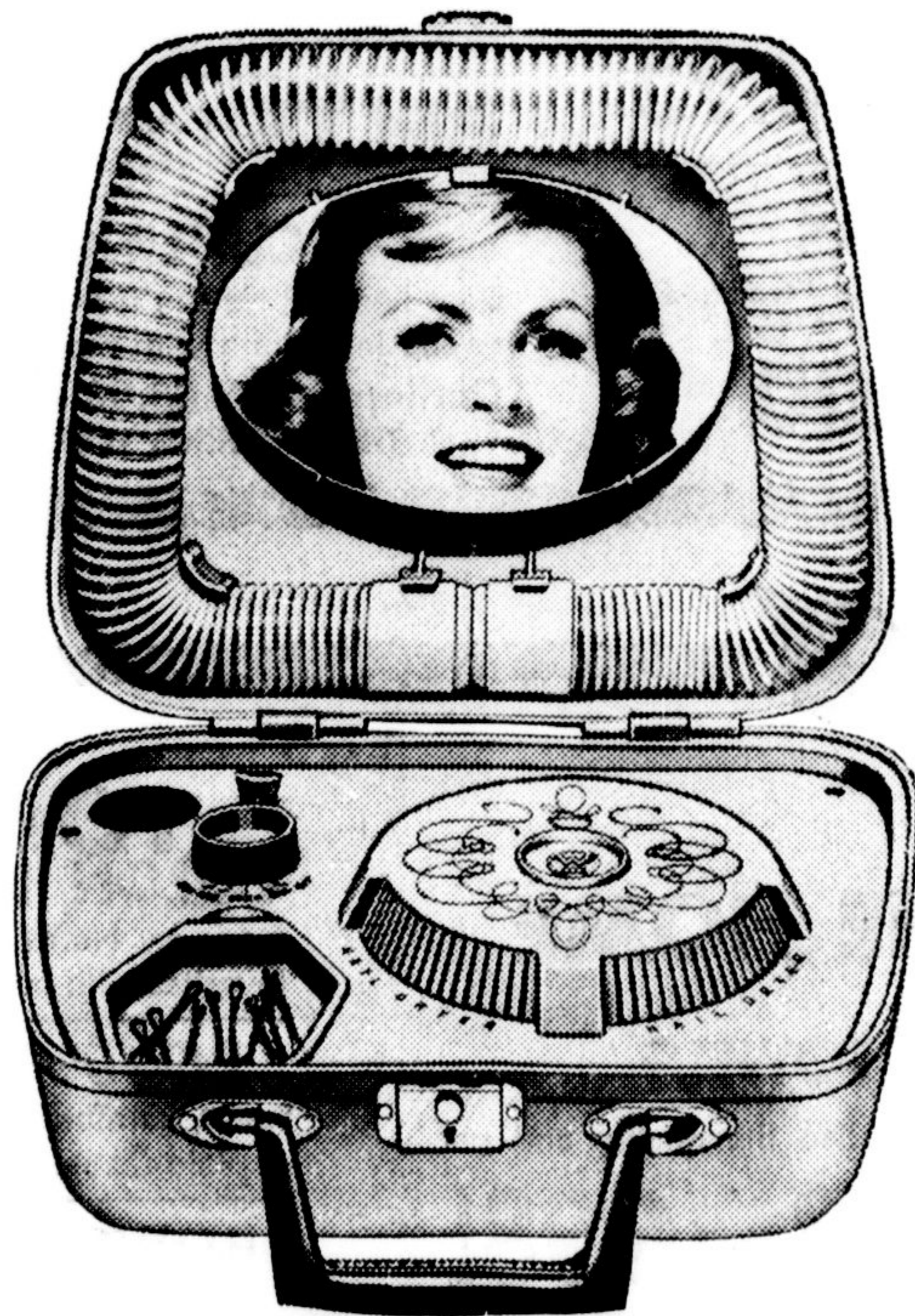
