

Esquering Voters Again at Polls Second Time Within Three Weeks

Tomorrow (Thursday), Esquering ratepayers will mark ballots for the second time within three weeks. This time they will vote to elect one school board trustee from a slate of four candidates named at a second nomination meeting Thursday of last week.

Seeking one seat on school board are Dr. C. A. Thompson, Julian Reed, James Ihmond and Andy Stull. All four men qualified at the conclusion of the nomination meeting which about 50 ratepayers attended in the township municipal building.

Other Posts Filled
During the first nomination meeting held to name candidates for the positions of reeve, deputy-reeve, council and school board, reeve George Leslie and deputy-reeve Wilfrid Leshe were

returned to office by acclamation.

Two school board trustees were also returned by acclamation when a third named, incumbent Mrs. Robert Armstrong, declined to run for office.

An election was held to vote for three of four candidates for council. Elected were incumbent George Currie and new-

comers Arthur Hill and F. C. (Pat) Patterson. Incumbent Walter Linham was defeated after serving the municipality for 17 years.

Each Spoke
At the Thursday nominations last week, clerk K. C. Lindsay was chairman and each candidate gave a brief speech outlining his intentions to qualify for school board.

Thursday, December 30 they will be open from 10 a.m. until 3 p.m. and from 4.30 p.m. until 6 p.m. Friday, December 31 they will be open from 10 a.m. until 3 p.m.

County Building
The Halton County Administration Building will be closed from 1 noon on Friday until 9 a.m. on Tuesday, December 28. It will also be closed from 12 noon on December 31 until 9 a.m. on Monday, January 3.

Milton Post Office will be open until 6 p.m. on Friday, December 24 and will open again for usual business on Monday December 27. It will also stay open for business until 6 p.m. on New Year's Eve and will be open again for business on Monday, January 3.

Both local dairies report milk deliveries will be made Friday and Monday of both holiday weekends, with no milk delivery Christmas Day or New Year's Day.

Holy Rosary Parish Credit Union Limited Reaches Quarter Million Dollars Objective

Less than one year ago the officers of Holy Rosary Parish Credit Union Ltd. set themselves a big objective and began working on their new goal—\$250,000 in assets by the end of 1965.

On November 30, a full month before the deadline, the officers happily announced the goal had been reached—assets stood at one-quarter million dollars!

To celebrate the attainment of this goal special guests, directors and their wives attended a celebration dinner at the Caravan Restaurant on Tuesday evening of last week.

Many Guests

There were 34 in attendance, including the Rev. Father J. J. Murphy, parish priest; John Hallinan, general manager of the Ontario Credit Union League; James Harkin, founder and first president of the local Credit Union; Ed Sealy-Jones, representative of the Ontario C. U. League in this district; Fred Wolsey, representative of CUNA Mutual Insurance Society for the area; Gus Harris, director of public relations department of the Ontario League, and Fred Massee, district manager of Co-Operators Insurance Association; plus their wives and board members.

President Andrew K. Meechan chaired the dinner and introduced the guests. He pointed out the Holy Rosary C. U. is only eight years old, and has only had a full time Manager-Treasurer, Jules Frytters, for one year, but the Credit Union has grown to 562 members and on the night of the banquet assets stood at \$262,000.

Praises Board
He reviewed how the group formerly operated Sunday afternoons from the library room of the school, but found new accommodation on the church property in 1963 and was able to open Wednesday and Sunday afternoons. Mr. Meechan praised fellow board members and the Manager-Treasurer for their diligent efforts toward the quarter million target.

The president reviewed the publicity and education committee had a three month share savings campaign during this year, which resulted in a net increase in shares and deposits of \$26,500. The Credit Union also launched its monthly news magazine in 1965 to keep members posted on

happenings and inform prospective members of the advantages of the Credit Union movement.

Also inaugurated in 1965 were the Christmas savings accounts, the family groups life insurance through CUNA and the plans for a charter flight to England and continental Europe for next year.

Stop Communism

Mr. Hallinan brought greetings and congratulations from the Ontario League and in a brief speech, reviewed the importance of democratic co-operation as demonstrated by credit unions. He emphasized the importance of further external expansion of the movement, to assist less developed and poorer countries of the world, and to prevent communism from gaining a bigger foothold on the peoples of the world. "Keep moving ahead by implementing more and better services to your members," he charged the Holy Rosary officials, reminding them the next goal—half a million dollars—was not far away. Appreciation was expressed by Jim Langedyk.

Reviews Formation

Mr. Harkin, the founder and first president, reviewed the early

days of the Holy Rosary Credit Union and he was thanked by Bob Clarke. Congratulations were also expressed by Mr. Wolsey and Mr. Massee.

Father Murphy praised the officers and all who helped keep the Credit Union operating, pointing out this was a prime example of what can be done by understanding, co-operation and hard work. Father Murphy said the church was not only concerned with the spiritual well-being of its parishioners, but also the ma-

terial well-being, and suggested the Credit Union was "a splendid instrument in obtaining a better material standard of living."
