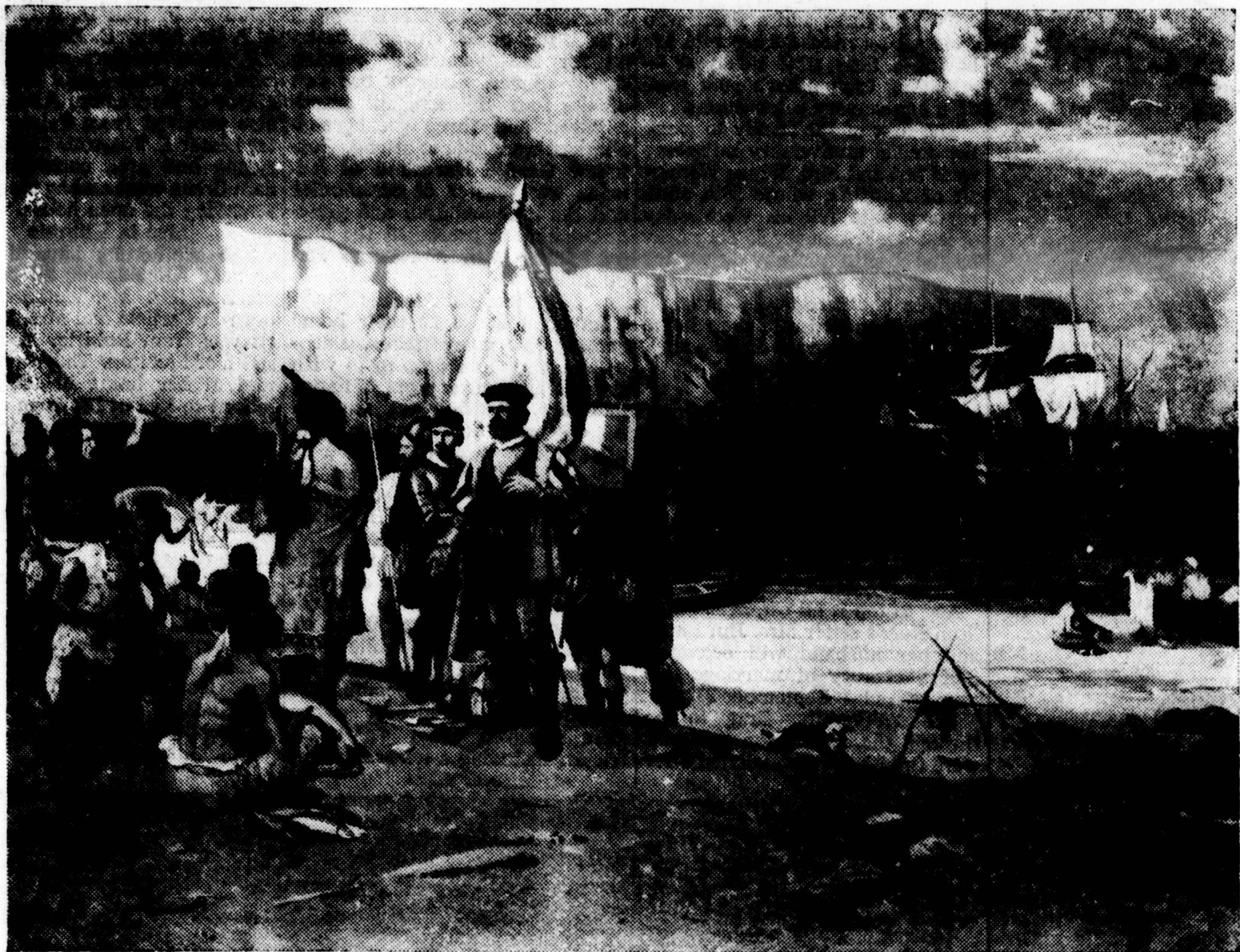

THE DISCOVERY OF CANADA

JACQUES CARTIER, AT PERCE ROCK, GASPE, GULF OF ST. LAWRENCE—JULY, 1534

In 1534, a French expedition under Jacques Cartier, a seaman of St. Malo sent out by Francis I, King of France, entered the Gulf of St. Lawrence. He passed through the Straits of Belle Isle, sailed down the west coast of Newfoundland, entered and nam-

ed the Bay of Chaleurs, planted a cross at Gaspé, and returned to France. In 1535-6 he made another voyage, and sailed up the St. Lawrence River as far as what is now the City of Montreal. In 1541 he made a third voyage.

The scene depicted of "Jacques Cartier at Perce Rock" is the artist's conception of an event that very well may have occurred, because Cartier spent part of the 12th and 13th of July, 1534, anchored in this vicinity.

Perce Rock is shown as it probably appeared in 1534, not as it appears at present.

Learn from TV

Weekly Show Teaches Math

Milton Public School students in the Grade 7 and 8 classes are learning about the new mathematics in a way sure to please — they are getting their lessons from the television set.

Beginning Monday morning of this week, senior pupils attending the Martin St. Senior Public School began tuning in to TV for the first in an 18-week series of educational television broadcasts on New Mathematics for Grade 7. The 18 half-hour programs are being broadcast each Monday morning, beginning at 10 a.m. on Channel 6, CBLT, Toronto, and the same program is being repeated a week later beginning next Monday, January 17, at 9.30

a.m. over Channel 11, CHCF, Hamilton.

In a letter to parents of Grade 7 and 8 students last week, supervising principal of Milton Public Schools E. W. Foster pointed out parents have already shown deep interest in the new presentation of mathematics, and commended the programs to any parents who are able to find time to tune in.

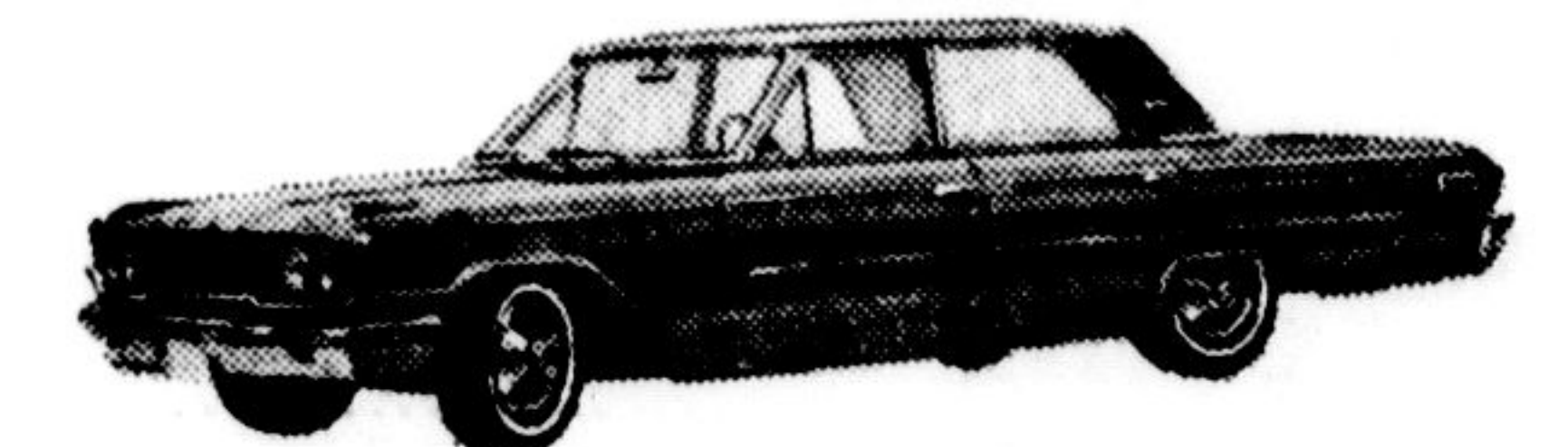
