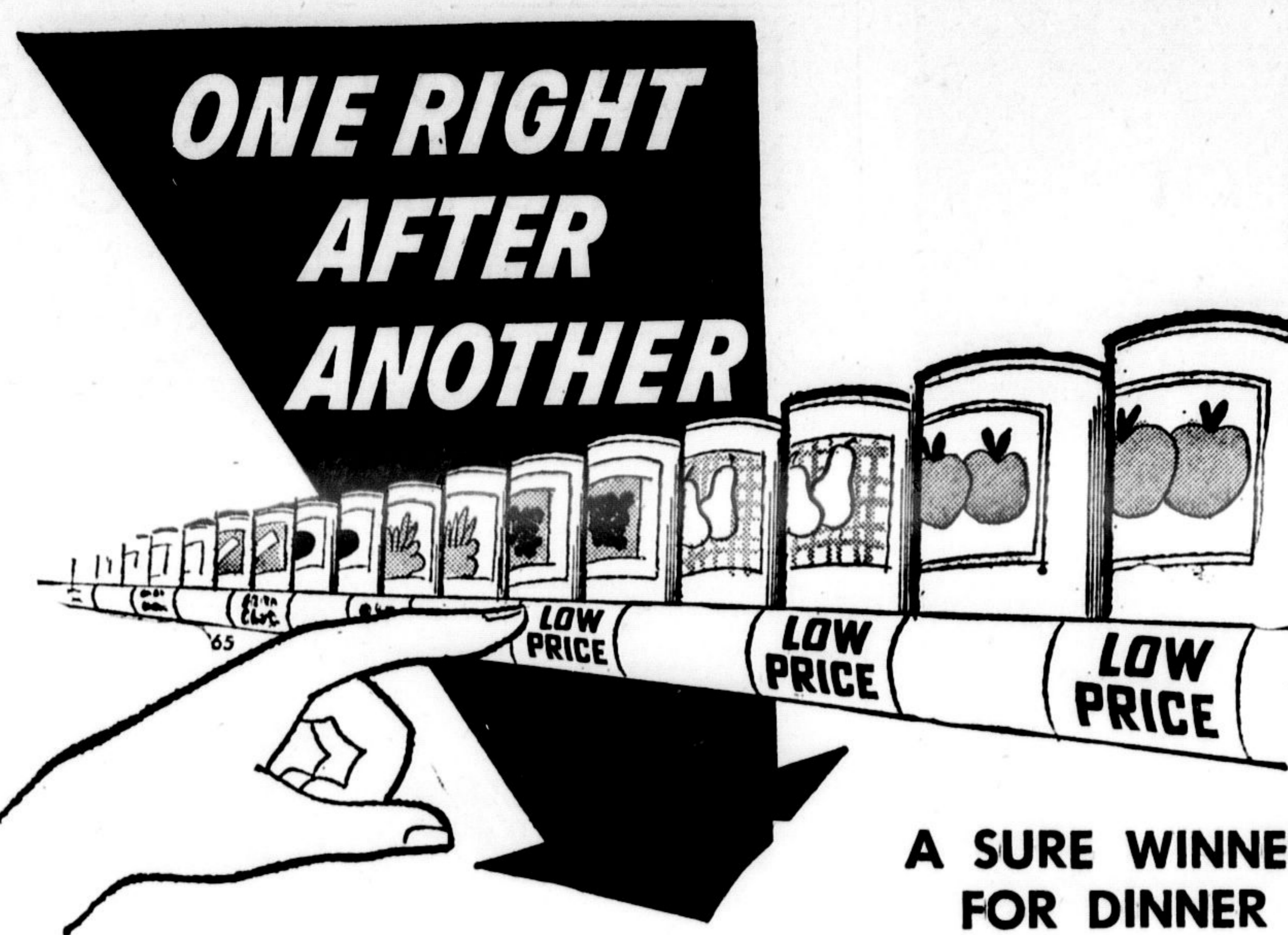
\$30 Aids M.D. Fund Fire Chief Reports
