### Course for 100 at O.S.D. Milton

More than 100 residence counsellors from across Ontario began a five week course at the Ontario School for the Deaf, Milton, on Monday morning.

Counsellors for the Ontario Schools for the Deaf at Milton and Belleville and the Ontario School for the Blind at Brantford are participating in the five week program that leads to a regular Department of Education certificate.

Wayne Fox, dean of residence at OSD Milton is principal for the course with Arthur Clare as co-principal for a two week period.

About 8 of the future counsellors are living in residence at the school with the balance, from this area, attending the daily sessions.

The lecture and discussion course will cover such subjects as communication, child psychology, residence recreation, outside classroom teaching aids and anatomy of the ear, causes of deafness or structure of the eye and causes of blindness depending on which school the counsellors will serve with.

Lecturers for the course include George Whetstone, assistant superintendent of the School for the Blind at Brantford; Mrs. Marguerite Brown of the Institute of Child Studies at the University of Toronto; Hylae Bryant, supervising teacher at the OSD Belleville; Dr. Brahan, consulting Child Psychiatrist to OSD Milton and Mrs. Evelyn Chorniak, supervising teacher at the OSD, Brantford.

### Milton Council Briefs

At a regular meeting of Milton Council on Monday members:

- Endorsed a resolution sponsored by the town of Orillia calling on tighter controls and requirements in licensing small aircraft. The resolution pointed out the cost to taxpayers of many searches for missing aircraft that travelled without adequate communication.
- Approved the appointment of Dave Smith, Broadway St. to complete the unexpired term of Dick Clement on the Milton Parks Board of Management.
- Approved the closing of Mary St. from Brown to Hugh on August 13 from noon to midnight to provide space for a barbecue in connection with the Ontario Fire Fighters' Convention being hosted by the Milton Fire Department.
- Reviewed terms of a recently passed by-law governing parks and agreed to a joint meeting with the Recreation Committee, the Parks Board and a committee of council to clarify the legislation.

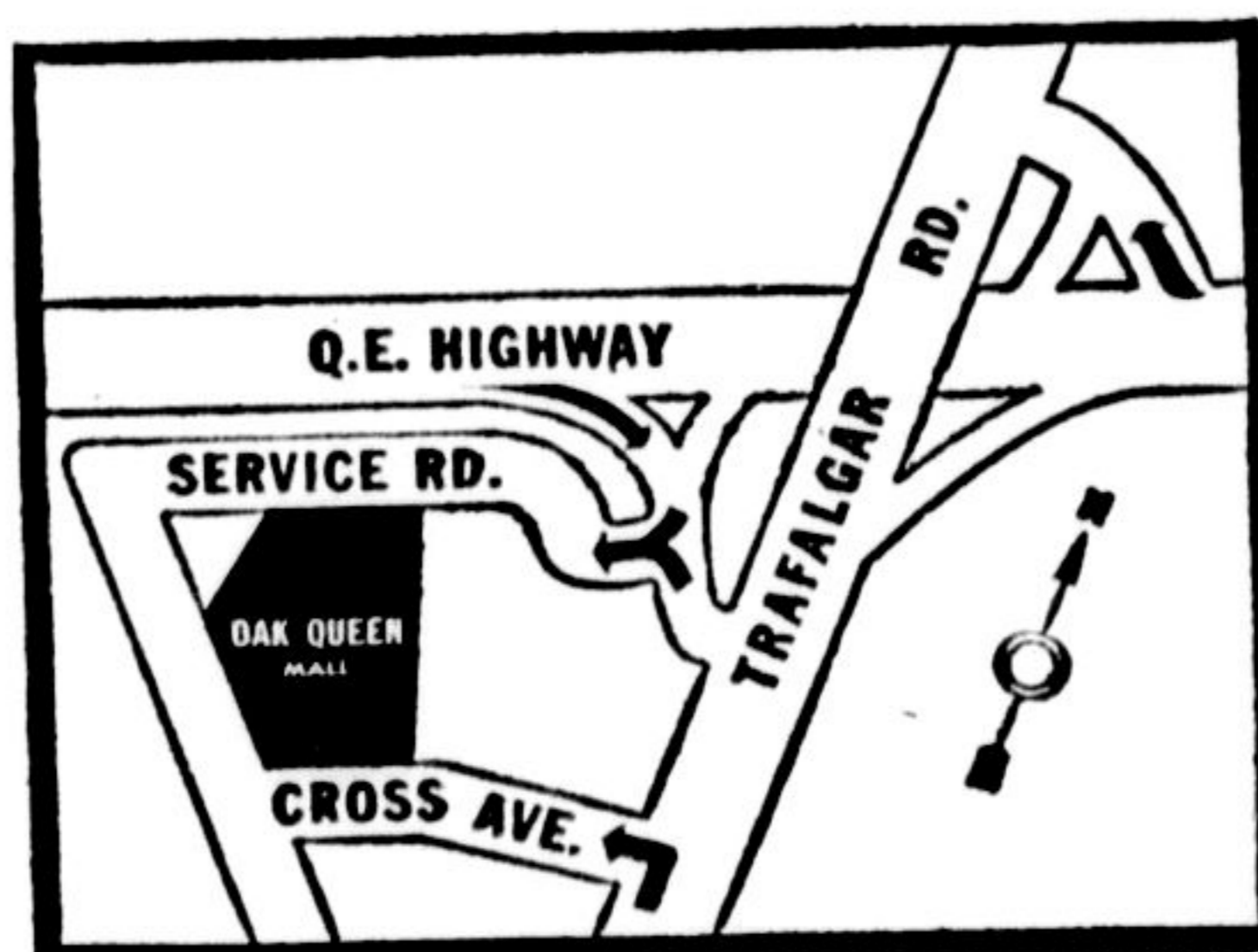

### Distinguished resident

### M. J. Carton 93, Sunday

One of Halton County's most active citizens, M. J. Carton, celebrated his 93rd birthday Sunday.

Mr. Carton, who was born on the First Line West, July 24, 1873, has lived in the County all his life. He is presently residing in Halton Centennial Manor.

He married Florence May McGibbon in 1898 and they spent 64 happy years together before her death in 1962. They had ten children, including Lloyd of Toronto; Cecil and Gerald on the homestead; Isobel (Mrs. Delbert Downs) of Hornby; Myrtle (Mrs. Albert Hunter) of Norval; Marie (Mrs. Frank Peacock) of Milton; Earl of Oakville and Elmer of Fergus.

One son Clarence, was killed in W.W. II; and another daughter, Margaret (Mrs. Cecil McCann) died some years ago.

Among his many accomplishments, Mr. Carton includes the moving of the motion that made Campbellville a police village;

the erection of a dam to catch the spring water from the escarpment, providing his home with constant fresh water; nine years service on Nassagaweya Council, beginning in 1908; 35 years as a director of Milton fair, ending in 1943, making him at present the oldest living member of the fair; seven years as secretary-treasurer of Nassagaweya fair before its 1912 merger with Milton; former Master-ship of the Local Orange Lodge at Campbellville; member of the Campbellville Lodge, Campbellville; former elder of Boston Presbyterian church; two years as Deputy-Reeve of Esquering; and the heading of a committee to write a centennial history of Nassagaweya in 1949.

Last year he snipped the ribbon to officially open Nassagaweya Township's new Administration Building. He is the oldest living former reeve of the township.

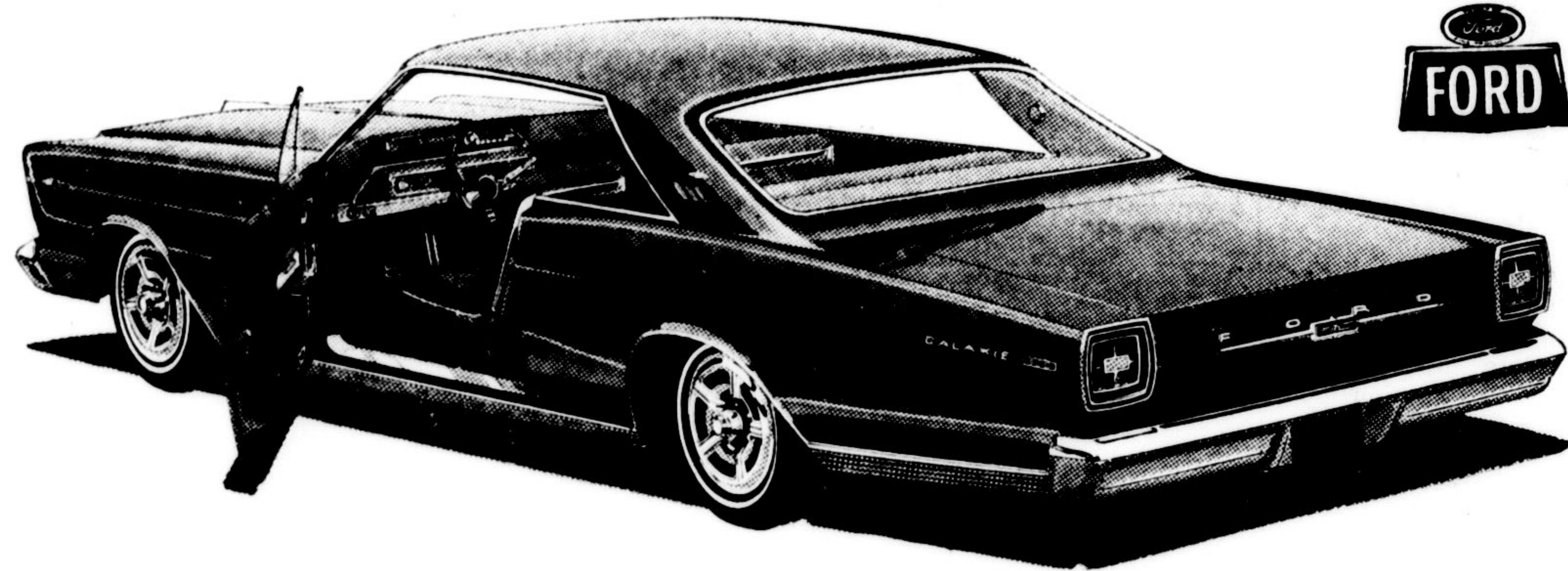
