Nassagaweya Council Briefs

At their regular meeting on Monday evening, Nassagaweya Township councillors:

- Approved the purchase of a new road grader for the Township. The grader will cost \$19,568.85 including taxes and after the trade-in, and was purchased from Dominion Road Machinery.
- Granted a donation of \$25 to the Halton County Plowmen's Association. The annual plowing match is to be held in north Oakville on October 29.
- Received an invitation to the 68th annual convention of the Ontario Municipal Association. A motion was passed indicating any member of council could attend the convention to be held in Hamilton from August 21-24 with expenses paid. Both Deputy-Reeve William Hoey and Reeve William Coulter will be representing the County at the convention.
- Learned the Ontario Municipal Board had granted approval for the drawing of specifications

and the calling of tenders for the addition to Brookville School.

- Approved the payment of \$1,236 for fencing screening and the erection of a baseball diamond at Brookville. The establishment of a park at Brookville is part of the Township's Centennial project.
- Agreed to have Township clerk J. C. MacIntyre contact the Halton County Health Unit and seek clarification of two letters received from the Ontario Water Resources Commission. The letters concerned recent examinations of sewage lagoons at Mohawk Raceway, but did not plainly define whether or not conditions were up to the required standards.

3 INCHES IN 61 DAYS
Here's proof of drought
Rainfall in Milton and district to date this summer has been among the lowest recorded, according to accurate figures on rainfall taken recently at the Kelso Conservation Area near Milton Heights.

Kelso superintendent Ross Johnson, who takes daily readings of precipitation using two gauges located at Kelso, reports less than three inches has fallen there during June, July and the first eight days of August. The figures cover 61 days but do not include Tuesday's storm.

The June figure was 1.76 inches, the July figure was .52 inches, and the rainfall in the first week of August was .66 inches. Mr. Johnson's figures show. His statistics are passed on to the meteorological branch of the federal government to be compiled with other figures from across Canada.
