Six 4-H Homemaking Club members of Halton County will be guests of the Canadian National Exhibition for two days this week. The girls are Mary Lou Brown, Limehouse R.R. 1; Laura Henderson, Georgetown R.R. 1; Linda Inglehart, Palermo; Dianne Pell, Palermo; Irene Keir, Glen Williams R.R. 1; and Lorrie Allison, Campbellville R.R. 1.

The Halton girls will be part of a group of 175 girls from 10 counties and districts in the province who will be taking part in this special program, which is sponsored by the Agricultural Division of the C.N.E. The itinerary for the two days will include quizzes and other activities related to 4-H Homemaking club work, a tour of the Royal Ontar-

io Museum, as well as visits to the Exhibition, with special seats for the grandstand performance.

The program for the first afternoon will include a selection of exhibits and demonstrations from different counties that have previously been set up at County Achievement Days. The Silverwood Club of Halton will be presenting their exhibit, "Sandwiches for Afternoon Tea", which they prepared for the "Club Girl Entertains" Achievement Day, last May. Laura Henderson will give a three-minute commentary on this exhibit.

Halton and Peel Trust reports on growing business

News of the opening of an eighth office in Georgetown this fall, and a balance sheet showing the past year's business grew steadily, were highlights of the annual report to shareholders of Halton and Peel Trust and Savings Company, released this week.

Assets climbed to \$64,252,454 from \$50,586,079 a year ago, the report notes. The firm has \$55,699,161 in savings and term deposits, plus \$46,646,933 invested in first mortgages.

During the year ending June 30, 1966, the firm reports \$1,896,643 in total revenue and a profit of \$188,143. Halton and Peel Trust and Savings has offices in Oakville, Brampton, Cooksville, Burlington, Milton, Simcoe and Delhi.

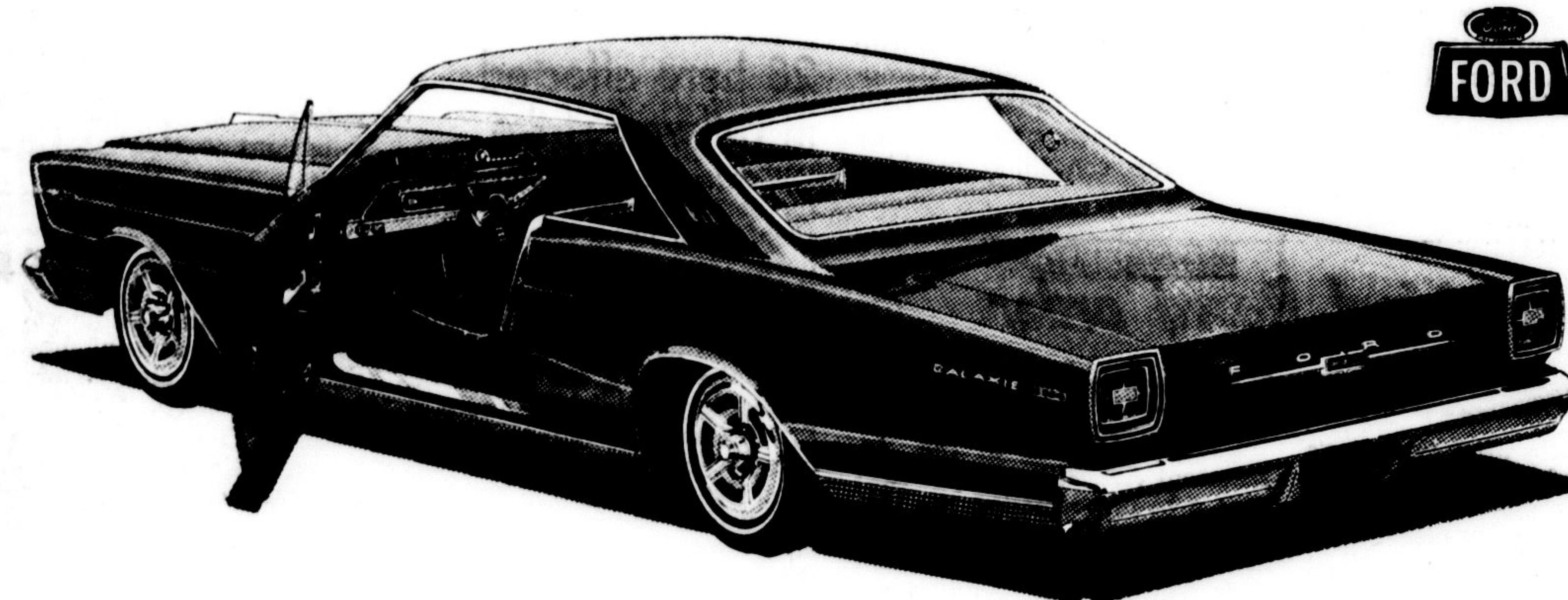
