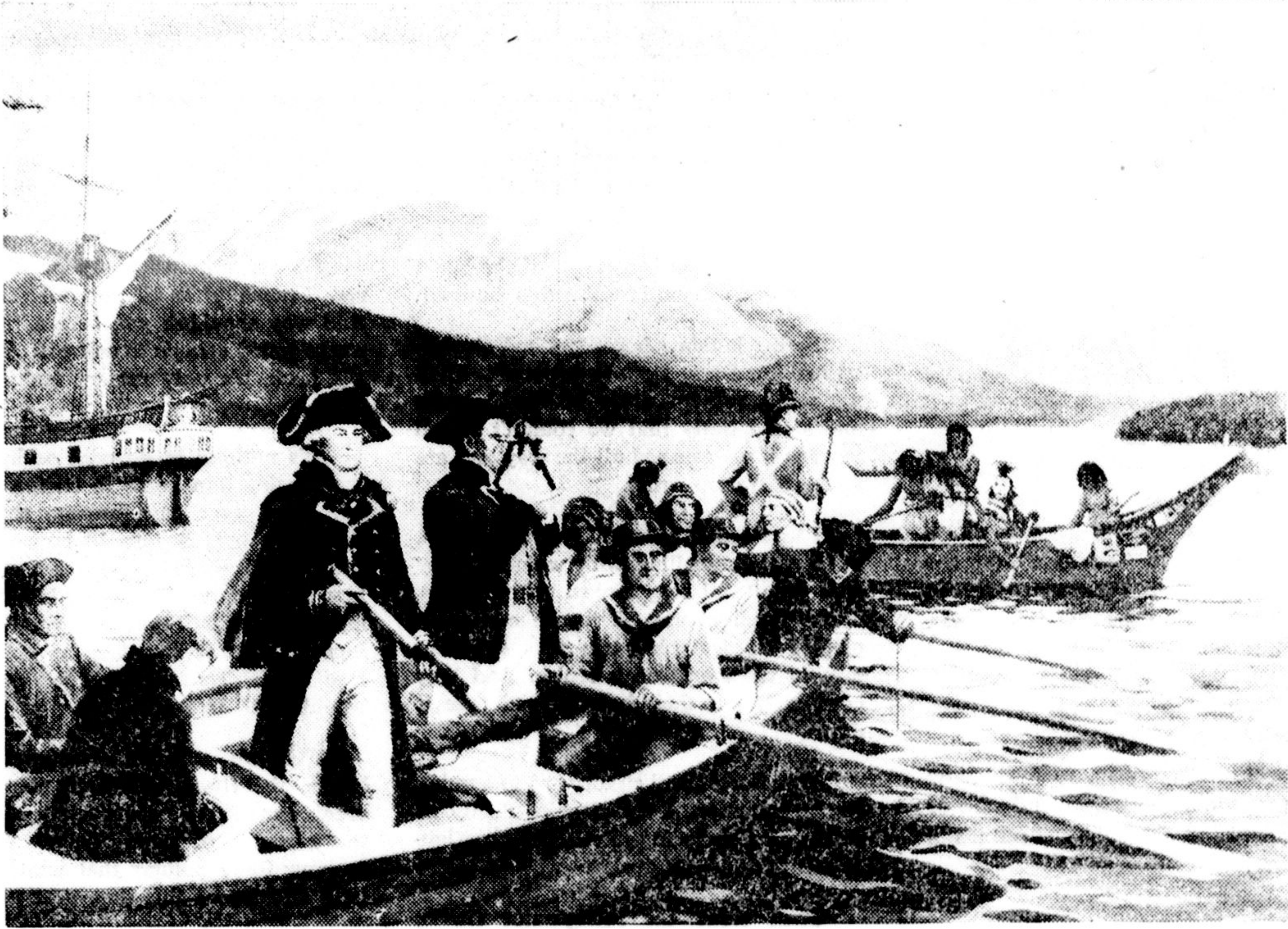

## Multiple Sclerosis Society organizing branch in Oakville

A Chapter of the Multiple Sclerosis Society of Canada is to be organized in the Oakville area, according to Colonel J. M. Dumwoody, president of the Ontario Division. The new Chapter will serve the County of Halton. The purpose of the Chapter, which will be the Society's 17th in Ontario, is to strengthen the Society and help it to serve the Multiple Sclerosis patients and the community in a more efficient manner.

Multiple Sclerosis patients and others interested in the seriousness of this problem and who would like to lend their support to the work of the Society in the County, are invited to attend the organizational meeting on September 21 at the home of Colonel J. M. Dumwoody, 2094 Lake-

shore Highway East, Oakville, commencing at 8:00 p.m.

**Multiple Sclerosis** is a disease of the central nervous system which is frequently diagnosed between the ages of 20 and 40. Often these young adults, many of them parents and just getting started in life, find themselves faced with a variety of symptoms — blurred or double vision, inco-ordination, stumbling or staggering gait, partial or complete paralysis.

There is no known cure. In many cases the patient is unable to work and so economic problems add to his physical burden.

The Multiple Sclerosis Society of Canada supports medical research into the cause and control of this great neurological disorder.

The above picture represents Captain George Vancouver, R.N., and a group of his officers and men, in a ship's boat, engaged in survey work in English Bay, north of Point Grey, British Columbia, in the year 1792.

The land to the right is the west shore of what is now known Stanley Park, and Siwash Rock may be seen on the shore line. To the left is part of the sloop "Discovery", and beyond are the Coast Mountains back of West and North Vancouver,

the higher peaks aglow with the morning sunlight.

Captain Vancouver spent three years in exploring the coast from the Columbia River to Cook Inlet, Alaska, and many of the names given by him to straits, inlets, mountains, bays, etc., on the Pacific Coast are still used.

## Golden anniversary for Hughes Cleavers

A former Halton M.P. and his wife, Mr. and Mrs. Hughes Cleaver of Burlington, celebrated their golden wedding anniversary on Wednesday, August 24.

A Liberal, Mr. Cleaver was elected Halton's federal representative in 1935 and he set a record for this area holding the post until 1953. While in Ottawa he specialized in committee work and for 10 years was chairman of the Banking and Commerce Committee. He was also chairman of the War Expenditures Committee for two years, and chairman of the Government owned Railroad and TCA Committee.

In Burlington, he worked as a barrister and was instrumental in the development of many of the town's subdivisions. He also helped establish the Joseph Brant Memorial Hospital and served on its Board of Governors until this year.
