

# Rev. D. R. Nicholson inducted at Campbellville, Nassagaweya

Firm counsel was given to both new minister and congregations at the induction of the Rev. D. R. Nicholson into the pastoral charge of St. David's Campbellville, and Nassagaweya in the Presbyterian Church in Canada on Friday evening.

The Rev. L. L. deGroot, of Dixie Presbyterian Church, charged the minister to remember the meaning of his call and acceptance, to resist the temptation to entertain his congregations and preach the word of God, to tackle all aspects of his task and use his God-given helpers, and to remember Jesus' problems when discouraged.

Turning to the congregation, he reminded them that they had called the minister; they ought not to sit back and relax. He asked them to remember that their farming methods had changed greatly and to be willing to make changes in the church's method if necessary. He urged them to pray for their minister, recognizing his humanity and frailty.

In the sermon, the Rev. D. J. Herbison, of Erin, emphasized the need of love in the church and called on the congregation to begin to cultivate a bond of love with their new pastor at the commencement of his ministry.

The Moderator of the Presbytery of Brampton, Rev. R. G. McMillan, Knox Church, Oakville, conducted the service and the induction, while the steps leading up to the induction were narrated by the Interim Moderator of the charge, the Rev. Lt. Col. J. M. Anderson of Oakville. The right hand of fellowship was extended by all members of Brampton Presbytery present.

A reception provided by the ladies followed, during which welcomes and good wishes were extended by the Rev. R. P. E. Jeffares, of St. George's Anglican, Lowville, on behalf of the Guelph Line Ministerial Association, and by the Rev. J. K. L. McGowan, of Knox Church, Milton, on behalf of the Milton and District Ministerial Association. Appreciation for the work of the Interim Moderator was expressed by O. K. Van Sickle on behalf of the charge.

Mr. Nicholson, a native of Brantford, took his arts studies at Waterloo Lutheran University, then graduated in theology from Knox College, Toronto, in the spring of 1965. Subsequently he served as an ordained missionary at Melfort, Sask., coming here from that appointment. As a student he served at Burks Falls and Shakespeare, Ont. Mrs. Nicholson comes from Summerland B.C., and they have four children, Roger, Douglas, Geoffrey and Calvin.

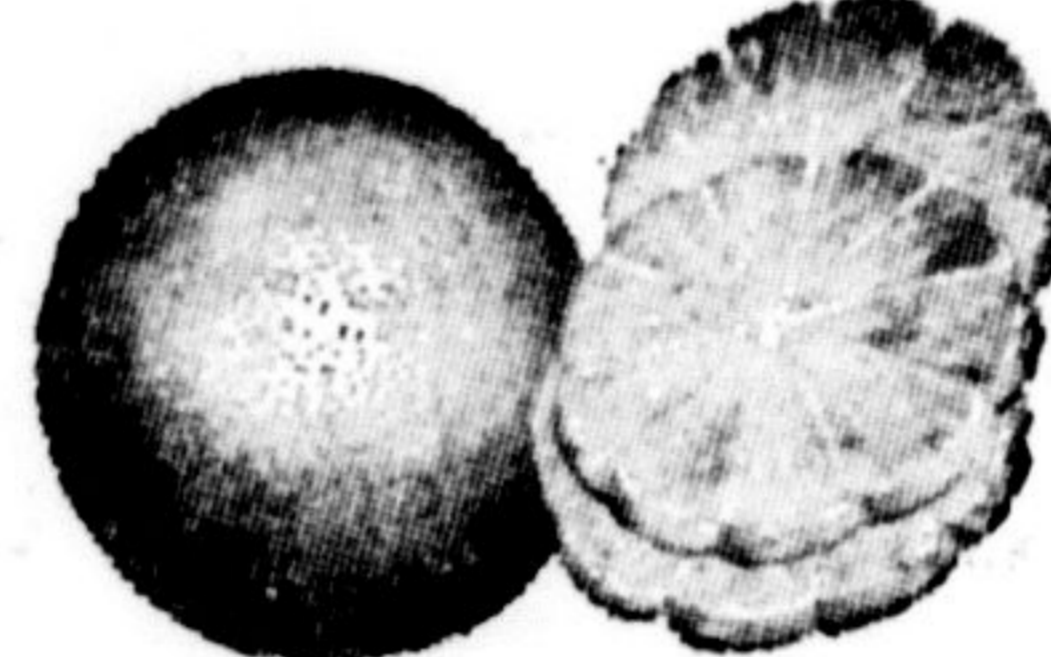
