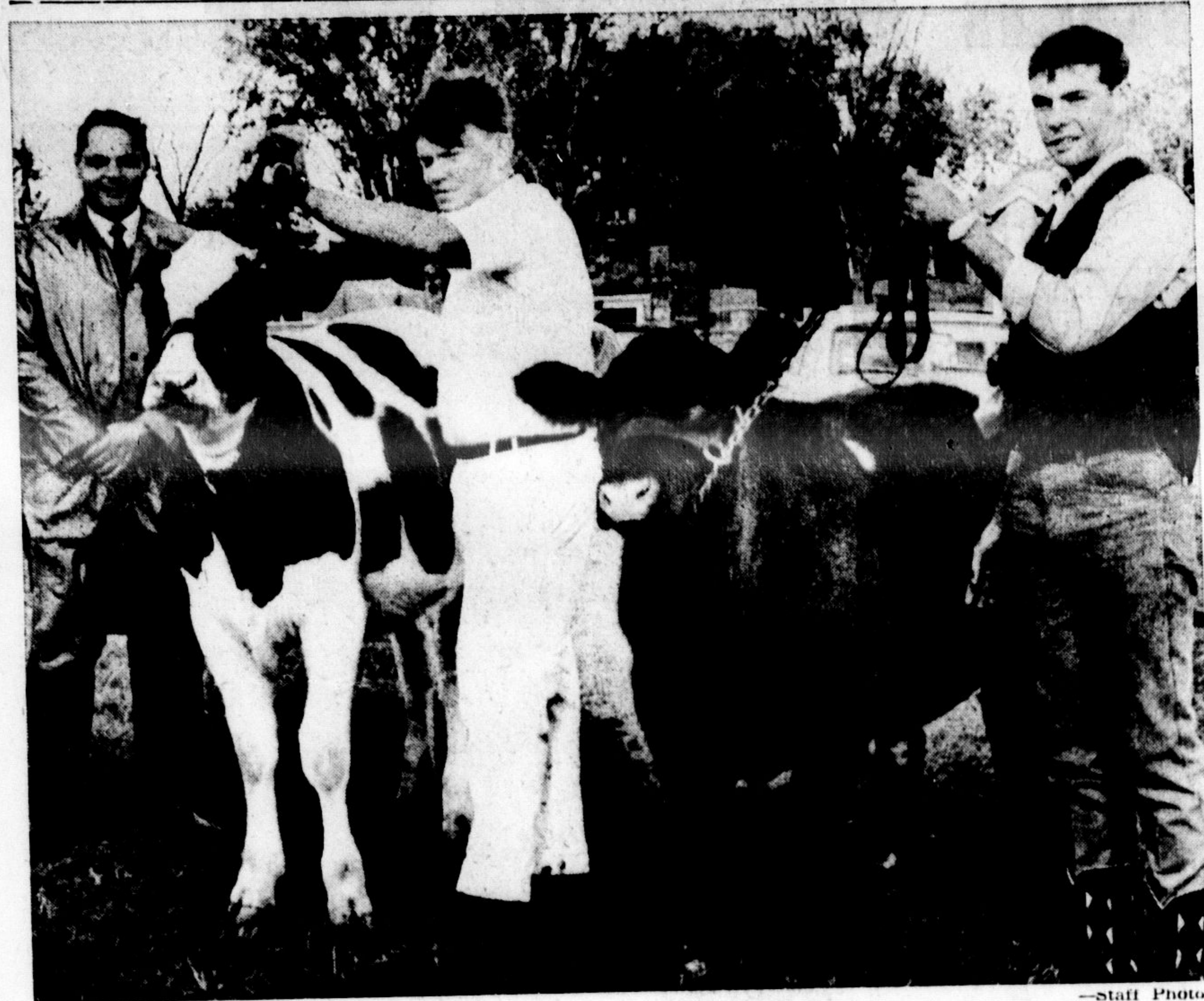


Larry Gardhouse top showman

73 exhibit 4-H calves at fair



LARRY GARDHOUSE of Milton was named grand champion showman in the 4-H showmanship contest conducted at Milton Fair on the weekend. Larry won the beef showmanship class, then beat out Larry Bennett of Burlington,

the dairy champion, in the final contest to make a grand champion. Judge Jack Riddell, assistant manager of the Toronto Stock Yards, is shown with Larry Bennett and Larry Gardhouse and their calves.

On Saturday, September 24, 73 Halton 4-H Club members exhibited their calves at their Achievement Day at Milton Fair. As each member led his or her calf around the ring, one judge scored the calf while the other placed the club member on showmanship.

The showmanship judge for all classes was Jack Riddell, Assistant Manager of the Toronto Stock Yards. Judges for the individual classes were Dean Sayles, Paris R.R. 2, for the Jersey-Guernsey-Ayrshire calves; Doug Gregson, Hillsburg, for the Holstein calves; and George Leslie, R.R. 2 Rockwood, for the beef calves. Eight of the 11 steers entered in this class are Queen's Guineas steers. These will be shown at the Royal Winter Fair in October. By placing first in the Beef Showmanship, Larry Gardhouse will receive the John Willmott trophy at the 4-H Awards Night plus \$10 special.

Inter-Club Dairy Showmanship — The top five members in showmanship in each of the three dairy classes competed for the Ward Brownridge trophy awarded to the Champion Dairy Showman, and the special cash prizes. The winners were Larry Bennett, followed by Murray McCaig, Don Brander, Marg Hunter, and Lois Hunter.

Grand Champion Showman — Larry Gardhouse and Larry Bennett then competed for the

Grand Champion Showmanship ribbon, also for the Jim McKay trophy. Larry Gardhouse, R.R. 5 Milton, was declared the Grand Champion showman.

JUNIOR FARMER AND 4-H EXHIBITS

Twenty-six exhibits were displayed in the Inter-Club classes in the Junior Building at Milton Fair. The judge was Alex Connell, a 4-H club leader in Wellington County and the past-president of the Junior Farmers Association of Ontario.

Grade B — Halton Jersey-Guernsey-Ayrshire Calf Club, Halton 4-H Potato Club.

In Class 4 for 4-H Homemaking Club exhibits there were 11 entries. These were non-competitive. The following were exhibited:
