

Milton now has

17 all-electric homes, 34 suites

Milton is rapidly becoming a community of modern, all-electric homes, apartments and commercial buildings.

Milton now has altogether 17 total electric dwellings. The community made a late start in this field. The first all-electric homes did not appear until about 1962 in Milton, but already 14 new all-electric homes have been built and three older dwellings have been converted to total electric heating. It is expected now that an all-electric subdivision will be started in the near future.

Manager O. L. Hadley, of Milton Hydro said, much interest

in all-electric living has been created because home owners can heat their total electric dwellings at the low-end domestic rate of one cent per kilowatt hour. He added that owners of all-electric homes are also enthusiastic about the warm comfort, freedom from drafts and cleanliness of total electric heating, as well as its low cost.

A new trend in economical, comfortable living has developed in Milton. There are now two total electric apartment buildings, and the owners report that all space was rented as soon as suites became available. The larger of the two apartment

buildings is Maple Glen Apartments on Ontario Street, which has 30 attractive suites including one bachelor, 10-one bedroom and 19-two bedroom suites. Unobtrusive baseboard convector heaters provide heat in all suites and hall ways of this four-storey apartment building.

Besides these 17 total electric homes and 34 apartment suites in Milton, there are two office buildings that are all-electrically heated. These are the Milton Hydro office and the new Ontario Provincial Police headquarters, for the Milton detachment, near 401 Highway.

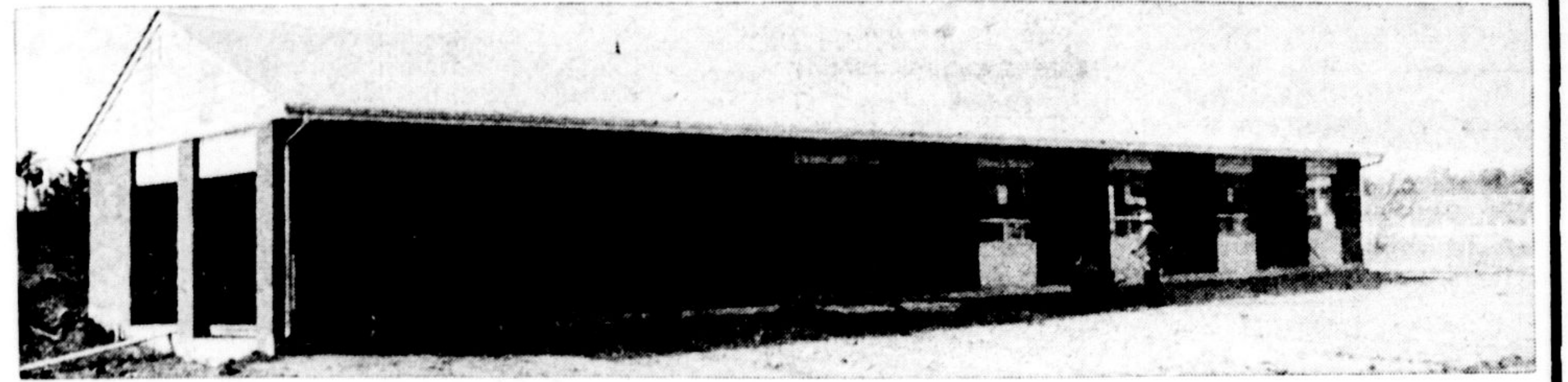

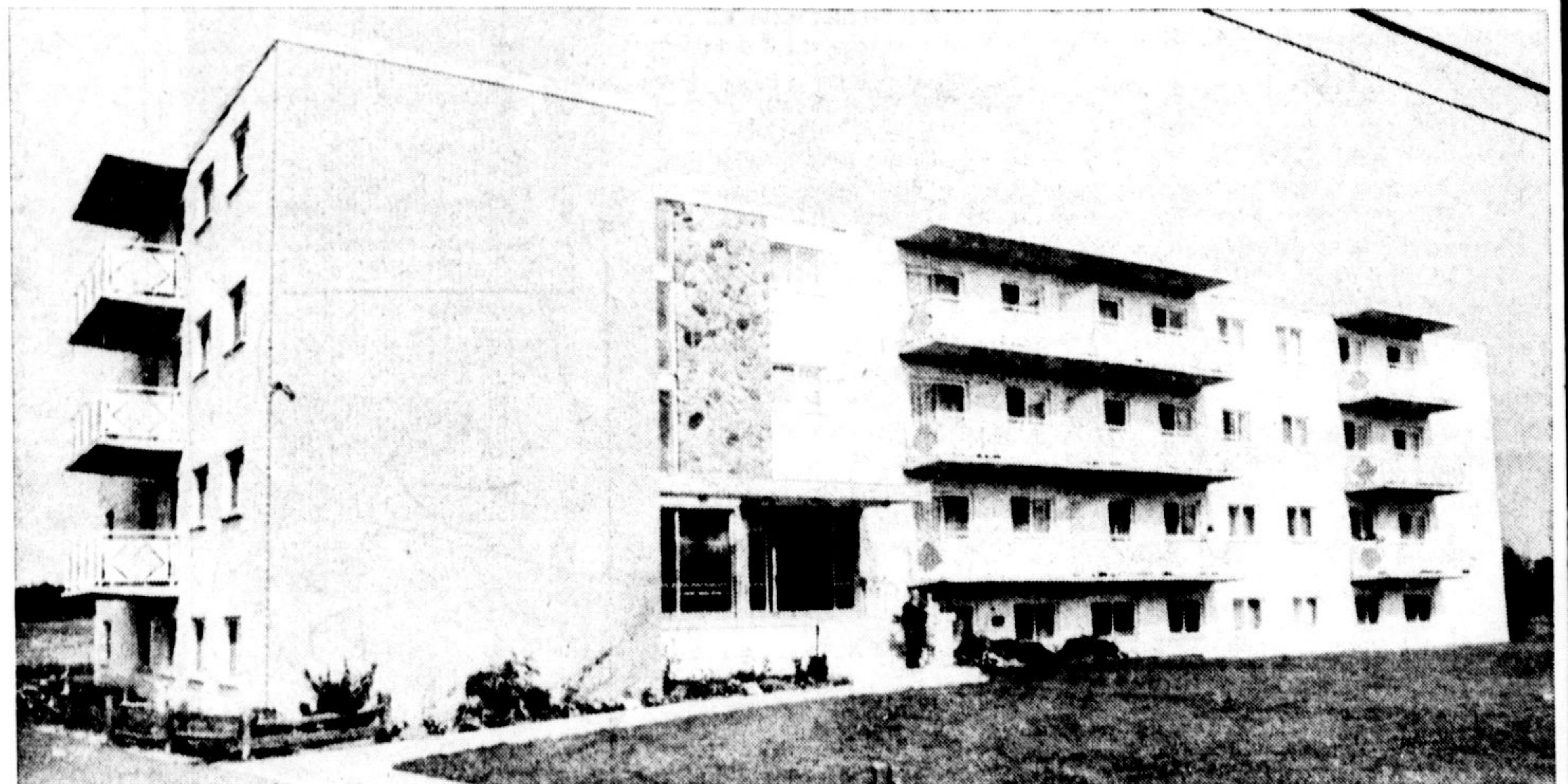


The new O.P.P. building on the Base Line at Highway 25 will be all Electrically heated
