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
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Crossroads Africa reviewed for nurses

Registered Nurses Association bership. of Ontario, was held last week in Burlington with 83 nurses attending. Guest speaker at the dinner was Dr. John Sibley, consultant in Internal Medicine and head of the Department of Medicine at the Joseph Brant Me-

morial Hospital. Dr. Sibley's topic was "Operation Crossroads Africa," an international project in which he has been involved since 1960, at which time he gave voluntary medical service in Africa along with 19 other professional people from the Hamilton area.

Dr. Sibley explained that the Crossroads Africa program was a vehicle to recruit young people such as university students, nurses, teachers from different races and backgrounds, to go to Africa in the summer to live and work with their African counterparts. The aim is to enable them to get to know each other as people.

The speaker illustrated his talk with a film entitled, "Crossroaders in Africa", which showed Africans and volunteers together building schools and hospitals to meet the needs in the villages.

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
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
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
