Dick Marshall scores twice in Sunday win

Captain Dick Marshall potted a pair of markers and goaltender Bob Lee came up with several big saves as the Milton Merchants squeaked past the Oakville Blades in a closely fought Suburban League game in Oakville on Sunday night.

Marshall's goals — one in the second and another in the third — combined with single tallies from the sticks of Doug Hearn and Roger Wildfong to produce the 4-3 win.

Lee, who has yet to turn in a poor game this season, was at his best in the final few minutes of the game as he robbed the Blades time after time when they stormed the Merchant net. Milton, playing without Leon Stickle, Brian Bond and Bill Anderson, used juvenile Ron Patterson on a line with Roger Wildfong and Jim Cole, and Maurice Miljourn with Jim Keane and Jim Workman.

Steve Lawrence teamed with Frank Schmidt and Joe Hore and Renato Bertoli were the second defense pair. The high-scoring Craig Brush, Doug Hearn and Dick Marshall line produced three of the team's four goals with Brush picking up four assists.

Doug Hearn opened the scoring at 1:10 of the second period as he banged in a relay from Brush and Wildfong. Bill Perratis tied it up for Oakville with an unassisted effort and Marshall's first goal of the night shoved Milton into a 2-1 lead.

Marshall clicked on Brush at the 15 second mark of the third stanza and then the Blades struck for two goals within 16 seconds, to tie the count — Bowden hit from Perratis, and then from Perratis and Phillips.

Roger Wildfong, who has seen limited action this season, pulled the trigger on the winning goal at 12:41 after taking a pass from Brush.
