Doreen Mahon. He said he favored the carrying out of the board's current plans.

JACK McPHAIL, school trustee, pointed out that this could be the last time a school board would be selected for the township. He noted 1967 will be a busy planning year for the school board.

ALLAN ACKMAN (nominated as a candidate for reeve): said several ratepayers and delegations had requested him to run for the reeve's post, but he indicated that he hadn't yet decided whether or not he would seek the position. He said he believed in local government and local representation and was not in favor of putting the power to directly govern the municipality in the hands of a few at Queen's Park.

Mr. Ackman stated he was proud of the actions of councillor MacArthur during the past year — "she shone like a beacon in the darkness," he said.

He said the Planning Board, considering the limitations of the report submitted by the professional planners, had done a capable job, "but we're not out of the woods yet," he warned. He said he had apprehensions on whether or not the good elements of the proposed by-law and official plan would ever be implemented if regional government became a fact.

He condemned Plunkett's suggestions on representation and indicated he was not happy with current expropriation laws. He told the meeting, "I'll let you know tomorrow whether or

not I will run." A. L. GOUTOUSKI (candidate for council) said he believed he had the experience to be worthwhile member of council. "No one has asked me to run, I'm doing this on my own. In fact, some have suggested l might wait, but I don't feel we have the time," he declared.

The candidate said whether or not he is elected, he will go after council with some of his ideas. He acknowledged the work of Mrs. MacArthur - in particular her stand on the twoyear term. "At this time it is essential that we do not have a two-year term because if a member doesn't do his job after one year, out he should go."

He said he would like to see thrift with the taxpayers' dollars and a safety survey. "I don't want to have to attend a funeral because the township couldn't afford stop signs," he


