## Education for our adults

If you'd like to brush up on the French you learned in high school or learn a little more about welding, oil painting, knitting and sewing, you should have followed the course taken by more than 225 town and district adults.

You should have registered for the annual Milton and District Advisory Committee on Adult Education night school classes, held on 14 Tuesday nights between last October and next March.

Night school has operated in Milton for a number of years and secretary-treasurer Mrs. R. G. King reports, "interest this year seems to be as high, if not higher than ever."

The classes, which began in mid-October, were held on eight consecutive Tuesday nights (the last night of classes before Christmas break was last night). They will begin again on Tuesday, January 3 and last for six consecutive weeks.

Fourteen courses are offered this year, including two very popular new ones — art all-media which covers most forms of painting, sketching and oil painting, plus one course in furniture refinishing.

Other courses include conversational French, welding, elementary oil painting, advanced sewing, elementary typing, needlework, needlepoint, knitting and crocheting, floriculture, rug making and the hostess course.

Teachers are D. Bover, James Hopkins, Mrs. Erla Brittain, Major Harold Newman, Miss Jane Benning, Mrs. Klopper, Mrs. Taylor, Mrs. Tosker, Mrs. Webster, Mrs. M. Oldham, Mrs. W. Larkin, Mrs. Isle and Charles McArthur. Mrs. Horigan of Brampton will take over

the floriculture classes after Christmas, replacing Mrs. Oldham.

Members of the night school executive include president Mrs. Glyn Roberts, secretary-treasurer Mrs. King and directors Mrs. E. M. Goodall, Noel Holland, Frank Sisson, Mrs.

Delbert Downs and Mrs. Dave Wendover.

The classes are conducted at the Milton District High School on Williams Avenue, Milton, in co-operation with principal R. C. Hunter and the Milton District High School Board.

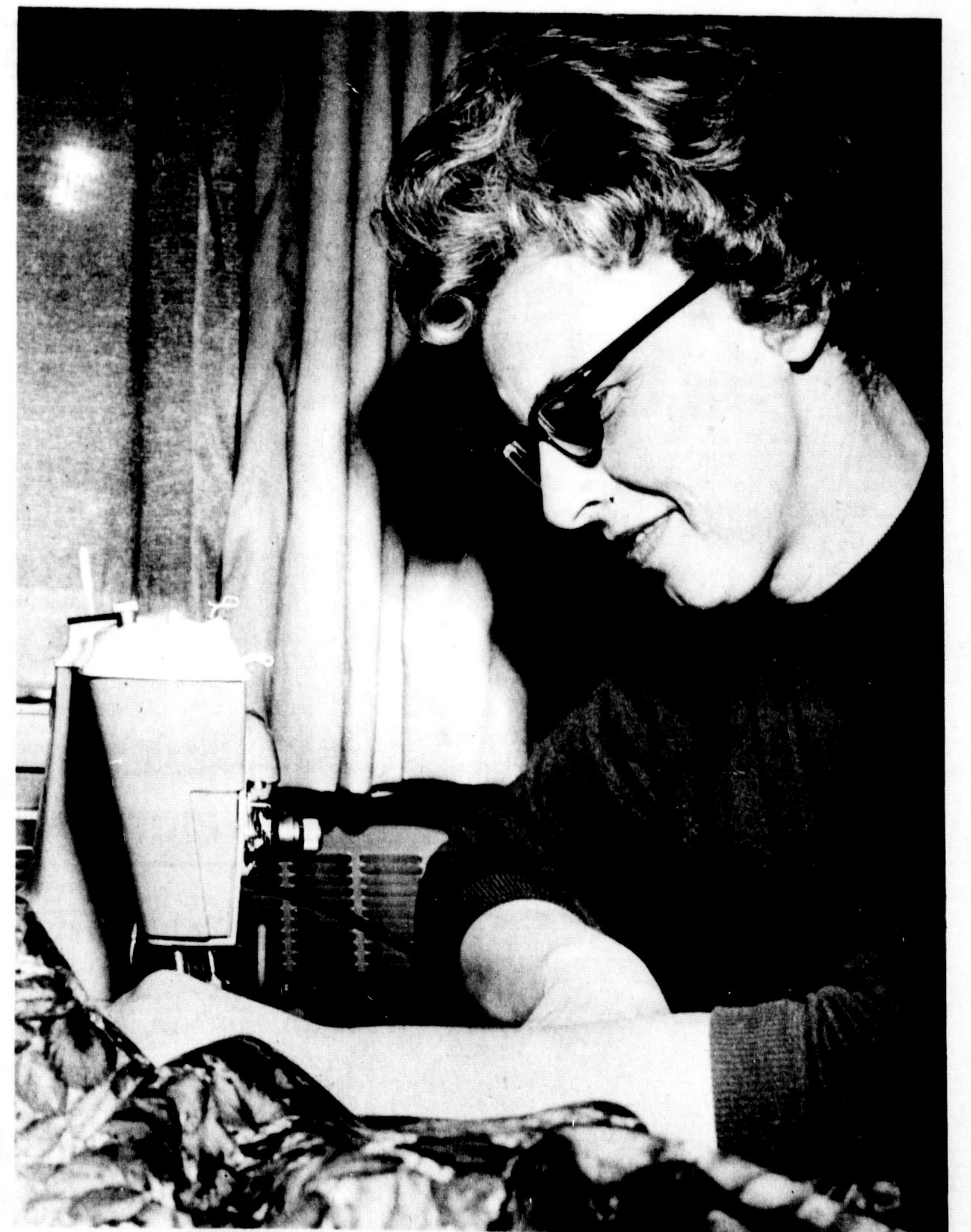
