OBITUARY

M. J. Carton

Well known throughout the district as a farmer, councillor, church worker, lodge member, fair board director and amateur historian, Michael John (M. J.) Carton of Halton Centennial Manor passed away on Saturday at the Manor. Mr. Carton was in his 94th year. The funeral service was held from McKersie Funeral Home on Tuesday afternoon with interment in Evergreen Cemetery, Milton. Rev. Stanley Smith of Boston Presbyterian Church officiated. Pallbearers were Ernie Wilson, Cliff Hardy, Finlay McCallum, Clarence McCready, Emmett McGibbon and Cecil Chisholm. Honorary pallbearers were Warden William Coulter, Wilfred Crozier, Art Benton and Edwin Harrop. Mr. Carton spent most of his life on the Nassagaweya-Esquesing Town Line farm he purchased in 1911. He was known for his keen memory for names, places and dates and could recall many highlights from his busy life. Born of the First Line West, Caledon on July 24, 1873, he lived there until he was 16 and the family moved to a farm at Moffat. In 1898 he married Florence May McGibbon. Their Town Line farm was once the site of a large Indian encampment, where geologists found the remains of a village and burial ground dating to some time between 1400 and 1600. Mr. Carton ran for Nassagaweya Council in 1908 and spent nine years on the council. He was Reeve in 1917. He moved the motion that made Campbellville a police village in 1914. Mr. Carton was one of two nonagenarians who attended the 50th anniversary celebrations in the village. He also spent four years on Esquesing Council, including two years as deputy-reeve. In 1949 he headed a committee that wrote a centennial history of Nassagaweya Township. He was quite active in the 100th anniversary celebrations at S.S. 3 Nassagaweya in 1955. A member of Campbell Lodge Campbellville, he was also a former master of the Orange Lodge. He was a member and former elder at Boston Presbyterian Church. During his lifetime he enjoyed working with fall fairs. He was secretary-treasurer of the Nassagaweya Township fair for seven years before it merged with Milton's county fair in 1912. He was a director with the Halton Agricultural Society and in 1943 he received an Agricultural Service Award at the conclusion of 35 years as a director. In recent years he has been an honorary director of the Halton Agricultural Society, and retained a great interest in the fair. Mrs. Carton predeceased

him four years ago. They celebrated their 64th wedding anniversary shortly before she died.

He is survived by five sons, Earl of Oakville, Elmer of Fergus, Cecil and Gerald at home, and Lloyd of Toronto, also three daughters, Isabel (Mrs. Delbert Downs) of Hornby, Myrtle (Mrs. Albert Hunter) of Norval and Marie (Mrs. Frank Peacock) of Milton. Another son Clarence was killed in the first war, and another daughter Margaret (Mrs. Cecil McCann) died a few years ago. There are also 17 grandchildren and 28 great-grandchildren.
