(Continued from Page C One) academic and vocational wings of the school and the sports building, is another unique feature about the construction. Attractive landscaped courts and rock gardens, paved walks, a fountain and terraces effectively tie the buildings together and give the entire campus a home-like atmosphere.

An 80 foot high clock tower stands dominantly beside the administration building, with three of the four large clock faces visible from all over the campus.

Three new staff houses were also provided, at the south end of the property, during Stage Two.

The Junior School program takes children between the ages of five and 12 years. Then they "graduate" to an intermediate school (which is encompassed in the senior school program) for three years, and finally enter the senior school

where the vocational training is given.

"We attempt to prepare the students to become self-supporting, useful citizens, who contribute something to the world, rather than depend on the world," says D. E. Kennedy, Superintendent of O.S.D.

"Since this is a residential school, the program includes academic training, health and recreational activities and religious education acceptable to various faiths. The school is for the child; our programs are intended to prepare the child for a happy, useful life, and each member of our staff contributes directly or indirectly to the attainment of this.

Several open houses have been held at O.S.D. since its inception, when citizens of Milton and district have flocked to the school to see this specialized educational facility at work. Officials postponed any "official" opening until the Senior School addition was ready.
