

Investigate stranger offering girls rides

An investigation into a man talking to and offering rides to small girls in the Norval area of North Halton was reported this week by Milton Detachment, O.P.P. in their weekly press release on the past week's activities.

"Parents are requested to report immediately to their nearest police department any such occurrences, with as full particulars as possible," said Sgt. C. J. Parkinson who heads the detachment office.

During the period May 28 to June 3 inclusive, personnel of the Milton Detachment worked a total of 895 1/2 hours and patrolled a total of 7,530 miles on area highways. As a result of patrol, 42 traffic charges were preferred, 69 traffic violation warnings were issued, 90 vehicles were safety checked. There were 45 convictions registered.

There was one personal injury accident resulting in two persons being injured; six property damage accidents investigated, and approximately \$3,140 in property damage was recorded. Causes of accidents were speed too fast for road or traffic conditions; inattentive driving; illegally parked;

driver lost control; and improper passing at intersection. Four charges under the Highway Traffic Act were laid as a result of these accidents.

There were 55 general occurrences during this period, including one theft; six premises found insecure at night; one stolen car recovered and one person arrested as a result, for other police dept.; two persons charged with dangerous driving. As a result of drag racing in the area, one person was charged with "Dangerous Driving," one person charged with "Racing" and one person was charged with "Public Misconduct."
