Elmer John Hornby, a prominent figure in Milton sports, died suddenly at his home at 433 George St., June 7. Mr. Hornby lived in Milton for 27 years, 10 years at his George St. home after moving from Main St., where he had resided for 17 years.
Mr. Hornby, a machinist for Halton County roads department, was born in Georgetown, April 25, 1910, and attended school in Acton. He was an executive member of the Tri-County Juvenile Hockey Association and past president of the Milton Intermediate Red Sox.
He is survived by his wife Stella May Hadfield, daughters Eleanor (Mrs. C. Ramshaw) of Bracebridge and Shirley (Mrs. D. Nassagaweya Council Briefs

At the June meeting of Nassagaweya Council on Monday evening, Council:
★ Learned Milton Council was not prepared to sell water outside town boundaries until Milton's expansion program is settled. The township requested water service for Milton Heights.
★ Decided to send to the Ontario Water Resources Commission for advice and information on the Milton Heights area water needs, and to explain in the letter Milton's statement and a desire for haste.
★ Approved a motion by Councillor Anne MacArthur to have Council hold a dinner in honor of those who worked hard to make the Township's Centennial Celebrations a success.
★ Agreed to have Nassagaweya's massive Centennial cake outfitted on a trailer for transporting to other parades in the County.
★ Heard a report from S. W. Savage, building inspector.
★ Granted the Halton Plowmen's Association \$25.
★ Decided to permit the removal of trees with branches overhanging township road allowances at a cost to be divided evenly between the township and ratepayer.
★ Approved the purchase of a half-ton truck from Trafalgar Motors, Milton and a 5-ton truck from Thompson Motors, Acton, as the result of a report from the Roads Committee.

Reeves meet, review consultative report

Reeves of all seven Halton municipalities met Thursday in a special meeting called by Halton Warden William Coulter, to make a final review of the Halton Consultative Committee on Education's draft plan for a single county board of education.
The committee's report will be voted on Thursday evening at a special meeting of the entire County Council in Milton. Burlington and Oakville have already expressed objections to the plan and prefer a two-tier education system, but all the North Halton councils and school boards are in favor.
Warden Coulter said Thursday's meeting was to give the Reeves a chance to review the report and ask questions of the Consultative Committee. "It was strictly informative, no decisions were made", he said.

Pedestrian safety wins town award

The Town of Milton received a pedestrian safety citation for six fatality free years at the eighth annual Planned Pedestrian Program of the Canadian Automobile Association.
The awards were accepted on behalf of communities in the Hamilton Automobile Club area by club president Judge T. L. Coombs.
A total of 34 Canadian cities were honored at the C.A.A. annual meeting June 23. Burlington placed second for overall pedestrian safety performance among all Canadian cities of 50,000 to 200,000 population. An 18 per cent increase over 1966 brought 141 cities into the association's Planned Pedestrian Program, making 1967 the largest participating year yet.
