## Milton Council Briefs

During a regular meeting on Monday Milton Council:

- Accepted the lower tender of S. A. Fay and Sons Ltd. for air conditioning the general offices at the town hall. The tender was for \$1,460. The other tender received was for \$1,538.50, submitted by G. Bundy. Councillor C. Fay abstained from participating in the voting and discussion.
- Noted it was not possible to abate taxes as requested by

H. Harris, on property he reported was too small for building and which neighboring owners were not interested in purchasing.

- Approved payment of accounts totalling \$92,054.52.
- Explained the Milton Girls' Pipe Band had not been used for the Centennial Park Dedication and Church Service since a brass band was required to play the hymns. Mayor Childs reported the girls had been notified they would be participating in the celebrations in August.
- Authorized the building inspector to prosecute any person who violates the building regulations.
- Instructed Solicitor T. Holden to investigate the rights of Archie Service to a water connection from the Kelson line, since he sold his farm.
- Directed a letter to the owners asking that trucks approach the former bus factory property from the Ontario St. road recently constructed rather than using George St.
- Was advised by the Ontario Municipal Board the town's application for approval of debentures for the construction of the high school addition would be held until the quota for 1967 has been established.
- Replied to a letter from Planning Board Chairman M. Kernighan, dealing with the suggestion lot coverage be increased and the conflict in parking requirements, suggesting the town's original motion called for parking requirements to be complied with.
- Agreed the water committee would meet with representatives of Milton Brick regarding their application for water since there was some confusion on whether the company was interested in the cost "of drawing the water to the site" or having it piped in. It was suggested the company be questioned on whether it would offer a letter supporting their annexation to the town.
