On Rosslake Park

About a year ago, a closing order was issued to Rosslake swim area by local government officials connected with the Halton Health and Safety Unit. To date, this order has not been lifted.

I believe it to be of interest to the public to reiterate the content of the ruling.

It seems that a swim area artificially constructed is classified as an indoor swimming pool regardless of size or shape and must, therefore, come under the same rules and regulations.

Rule 1: There must be shower baths erected on the beach. Rule 2: Water must be periodically chlorinated.

Rule 3: A lifeguard must be on duty at all times. I consider these regulations


to be impractical and impossible to comply with. As a result, to operate ignoring these rules I face possible court charge.

The Rosslake swim area was originally designed with the intention of sharing its use with the public and rather than making it a legal battleground, I have, after careful consideration, decided on offering its facilities, as well as camping, and picnicking (tables when available) to the public with no admission or parking charges for the above mentioned during this season.

For those who wish to accept this offer there will, in addition, to facilities offered for free, recreational attractions namely: hayrides, horse and pony rides, cruise on the stern-wheeler "Ponderossa" at a nominal charge. A snack bar will be in operation for public conveniences.

In consideration of the interest shown by the public concerning the progress of this swim area I hope this letter will explain some of the difficulties I have encountered regarding its operation.
