

**TOWN OF BURLINGTON PUBLIC MEETING**

The Building and Planning Committee of the Council of the Town of Burlington will hold a public meeting on Thursday, August 24, 1967, at 8:00 p.m., in Fairview Public School, 2596 No. 5 Side Road.

The purpose of the meeting is to receive briefs and hear submissions either in favor of or opposed to By-law 3365, a copy of which is shown below. The area affected by the By-law is primarily all of the area in the Town of Burlington, north of the Upper Middle Road.

**The Corporation of The Town of Burlington By-Law No. 3365**

A By-law to amend By-law 1642. (Lot requirements in Agricultural and O Districts.)

THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF BURLINGTON HEREBY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. Subsection 4 of Section 8 of By-law 1642 is amended by striking out:

"Every lot or tract of land in an 'A' district shall have a width of at least 100 feet and an area of at least 20,000 square feet."

and substituting:

"(a) every lot in an 'A' district shall have an area of at least 20,000 square feet;

(b) every lot in an 'A' district shall be contiguous to a street and shall have a width at the street and a width as defined in clause 126 of section 2 in accordance with the following table:

**Lot Area - Minimum width at street and minimum width as defined in 2 (126):**

Less than 30,000 square feet—100 feet.

More than 30,000 square feet but not more than 1 acre — 125 feet.

More than 1 acre but not more than 2 acres — 150 feet.

More than 2 acres but not more than 4 acres—250 feet.

More than 4 acres but not more than 6 acres—300 feet.

More than 6 acres but not more than 8 acres—350 feet.

More than 8 acres but not more than 10 acres—400 feet.

More than 10 acres but not more than 15 acres—500 feet.

More than 15 acres—600 feet.

(c) no person shall erect or use any dwelling on any lot in an 'A' district that does not comply with clauses (a) and (b) above respecting lot area and width provided that every lot in existence on the date of the passing of By-law 3365 shall be deemed to comply with said clauses (a) and (b) in respect of area and width."

2. Subsection (1) of section 23 of By-law 1642 is amended by striking out:

"The uses permitted in an 'A' district are permitted in an 'O' district."

and substituting:

"The uses permitted in an 'A' district are permitted in an 'O' district and the requirements set out in section 8 above apply."

3. This By-law shall not come into force unless approved by the Ontario Municipal Board but subject to such approval, shall have effect from the date of its passing.

**ACTON**

A trial project in the rehabilitation of small reservoirs in Ontario will get underway on Fairy Lake, Acton, in the near future.

The Credit Valley Conservation Authority, in co-operation with the Provincial Government's Department of Energy and Resources Management, has accepted the tender of Cummins Construction Company, Toronto for dredging approximately 400,000 cubic yards of silt from the lake.

If this pilot project proves economically feasible the many mill ponds and small reservoirs in Ontario, silted through the years until they no longer are of any use for water storage, may get a new lease on life.

A small floating dredge which may be transported by highway and assembled at the pond in question will be used to pump the muck from the bottom of the lake. This muck will be pumped to slurry areas adjacent to Fairy Lake and after settling the water will drain back into the lake. Work will continue for at least six months with final clearing up in the spring of 1968.

Up until this time the Provincial Government would not pay grants on any work of the Authority on privately owned land. This new project sets a precedent which may revolutionize conservation practices in Ontario.

R. R. Parker, Chairman of the Flood and Pollution Control Advisory Board of the Credit Valley Conservation Authority brought the idea to the Conservation Branch and will see his idea brought to completion in his home town of Acton.

The Ontario Housing Corporation at the request of the Council of the Town of Acton, is conducting a survey to determine the need and demand for public rental housing in the municipality.

This proposed housing would accommodate either families or senior citizens who are either living or working in Acton and whose present accommodation is inadequate in some significant way. In the case of families, the housing accommodation would probably be two-storey and either of row or semi-detached design.

The size of the units would vary according to the needs of the community, but they could have as many as four or five bedrooms.

**BURLINGTON**

More than 2,000 homes in the Aldershot area were without electric power for a time one afternoon last week.

The blackout came when lightning hit a 2,700-volt cable leading to an Ontario Hydro substation on Partridge Drive. A local Public Utilities Commission official said the power interruption lasted for three hours in some areas.

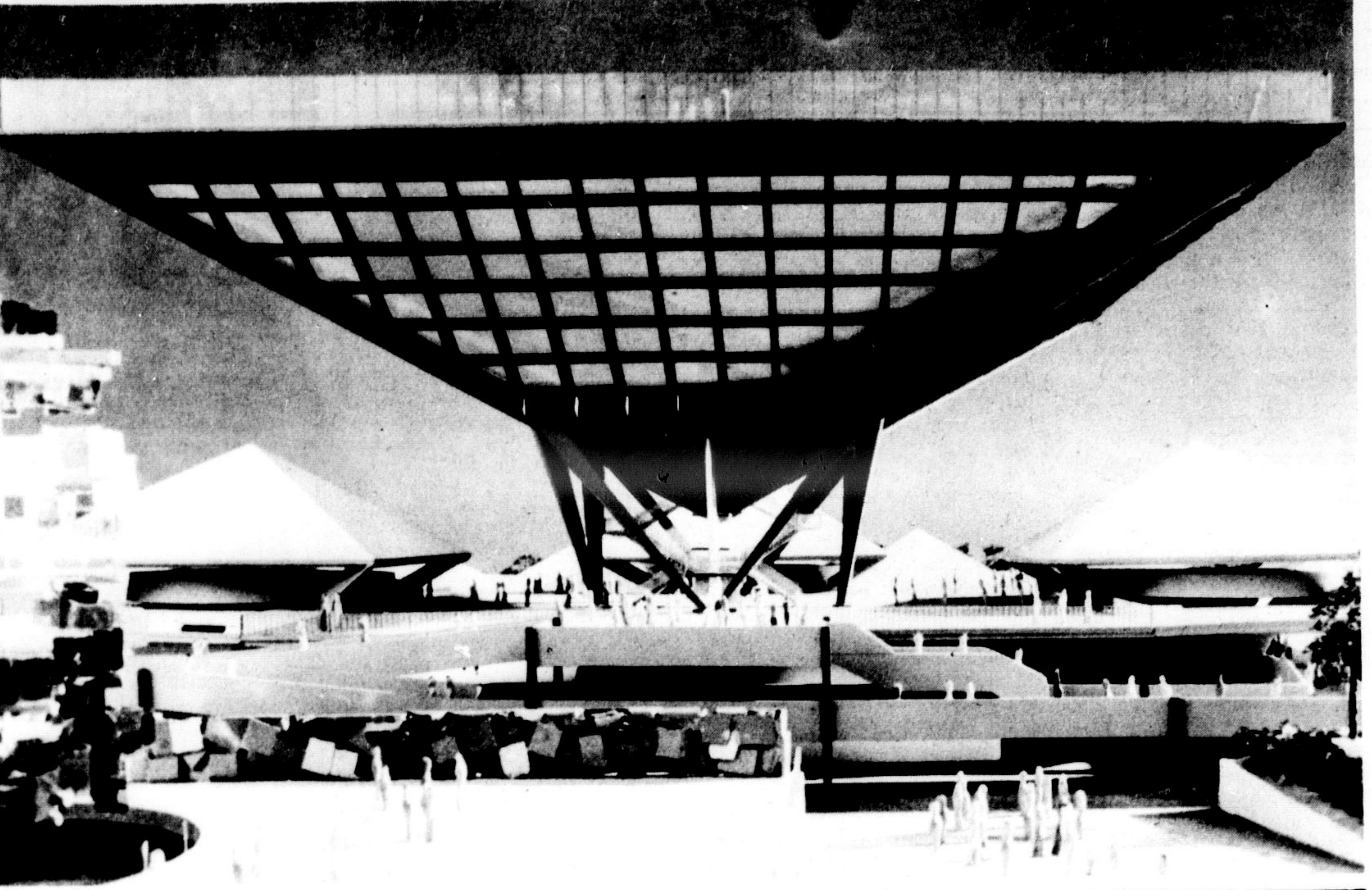
