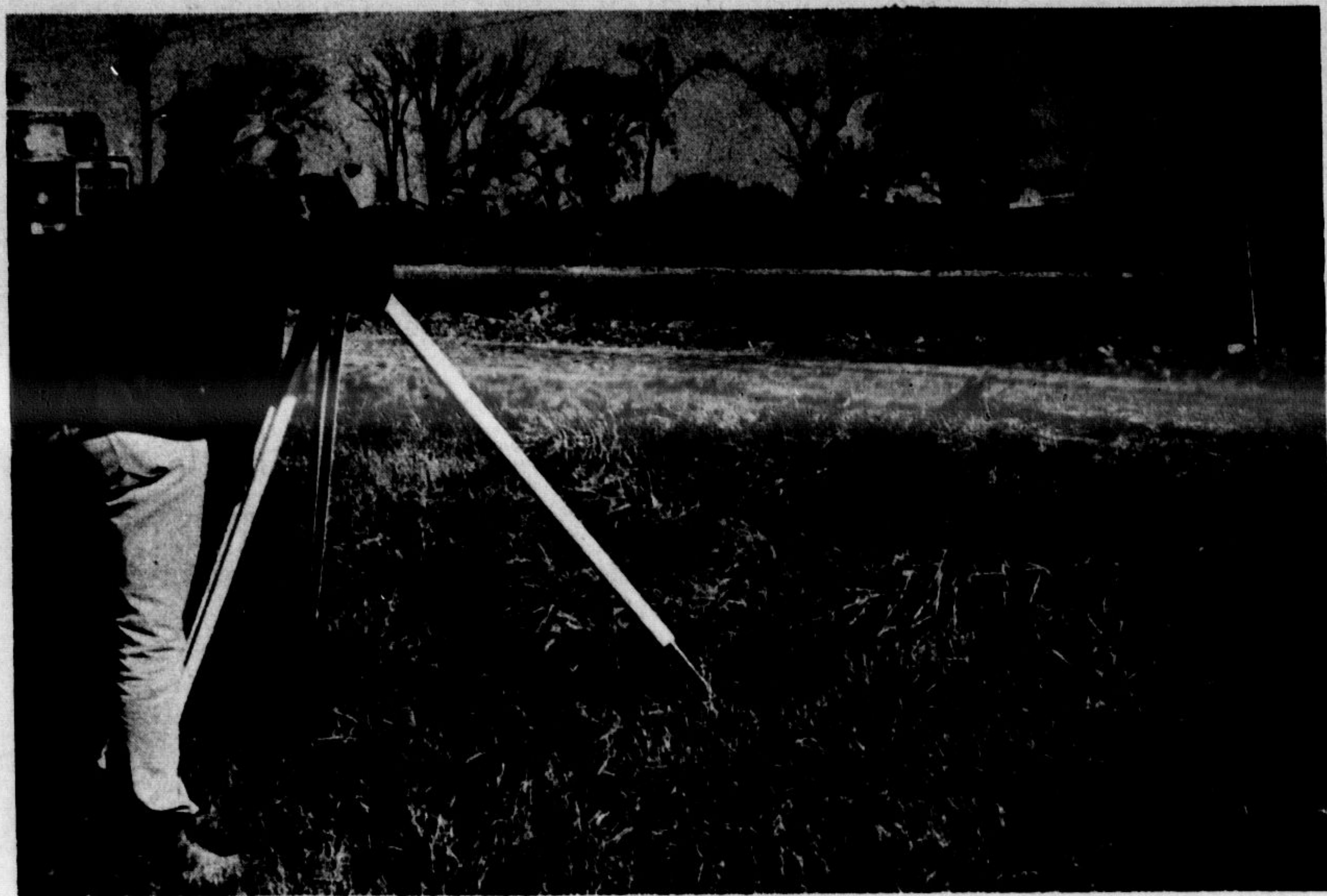
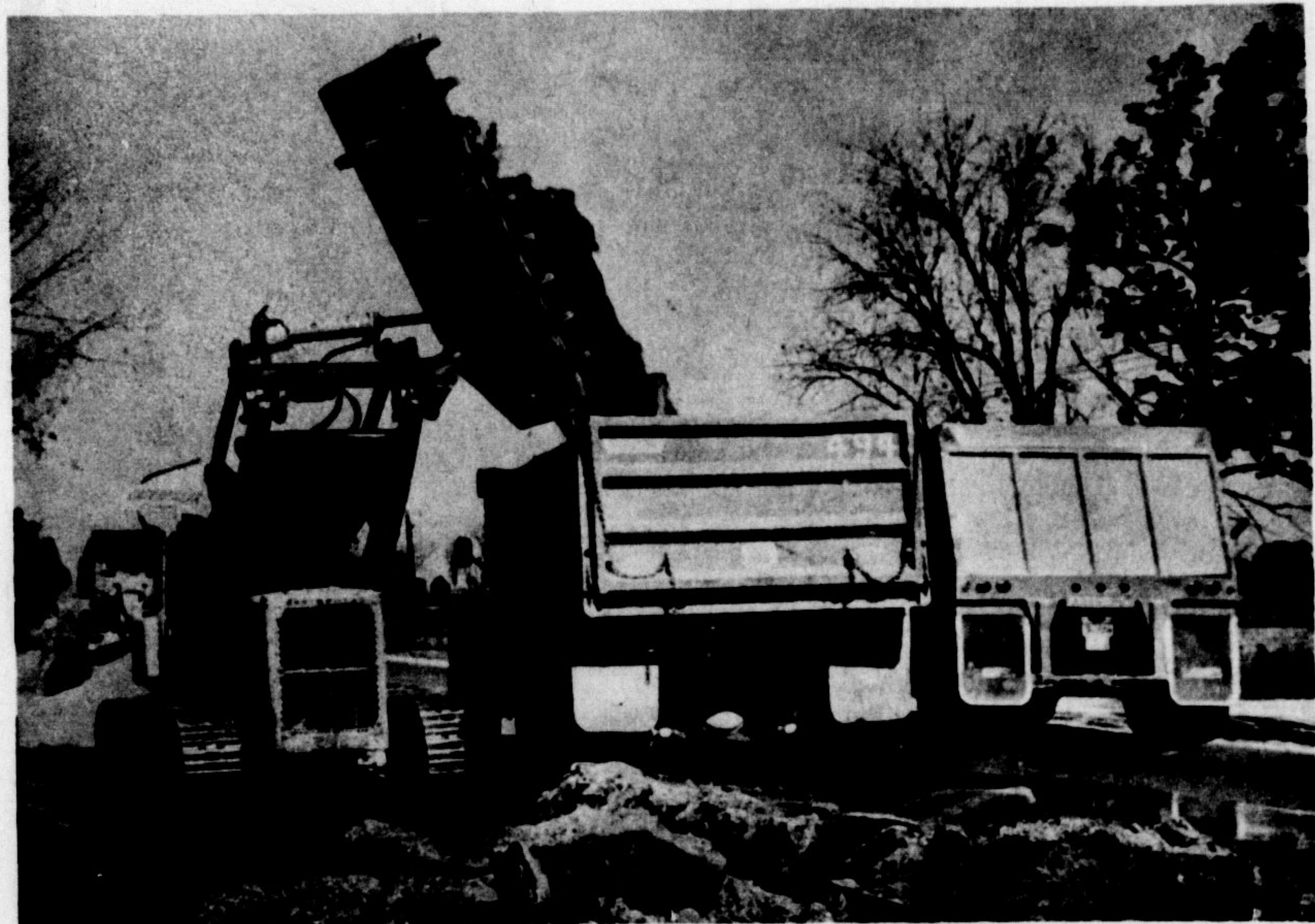


Ripping up Highway 25
