From **Kemptville** comes the news that fishermen do not catch all the trophy size fish—muskellunge 30 to 54 inches in length and weighing up to 40 lbs. were caught in trap nets by the Department of Lands and Forests. In their nets, set to study game fish concentrations, were 62 muskies, eight walleye, 54 northern pike, 582 smallmouth bass and 55 largemouth bass.

These fish were tagged and released. Also in this one 16-foot trap net, three eight-foot and two six-foot traps were used. Also included in the catch were: 26,018 bullhead, 114 white bass, 323 rock bass, 2,266 crappies, 3,100 yellow perch and 1,831 white suckers. This is an amazing concentration of fish in one area.
