Diversion channel project will start

A final go-ahead was given the Halton Region Conservation Authority's Morrison-Wedgewood Creek diversion project by Halton Judge Alan B. Sprague in a hearing on Tuesday morning.

On Friday, the federal government gave its final blessing to the project. Residents of the Rancliffe Rd. area who were objecting to the Authority's expropriation payments "backed down" said one conservation official when the hearing was held before the judge.

The homeowners had threatened an injunction against the work. In recent weeks they have thrown stones at Authority surveyors who were working on the site of the creek diversion. Construction of the two and a half mile diversion channel was expected to start today (Wednesday).
