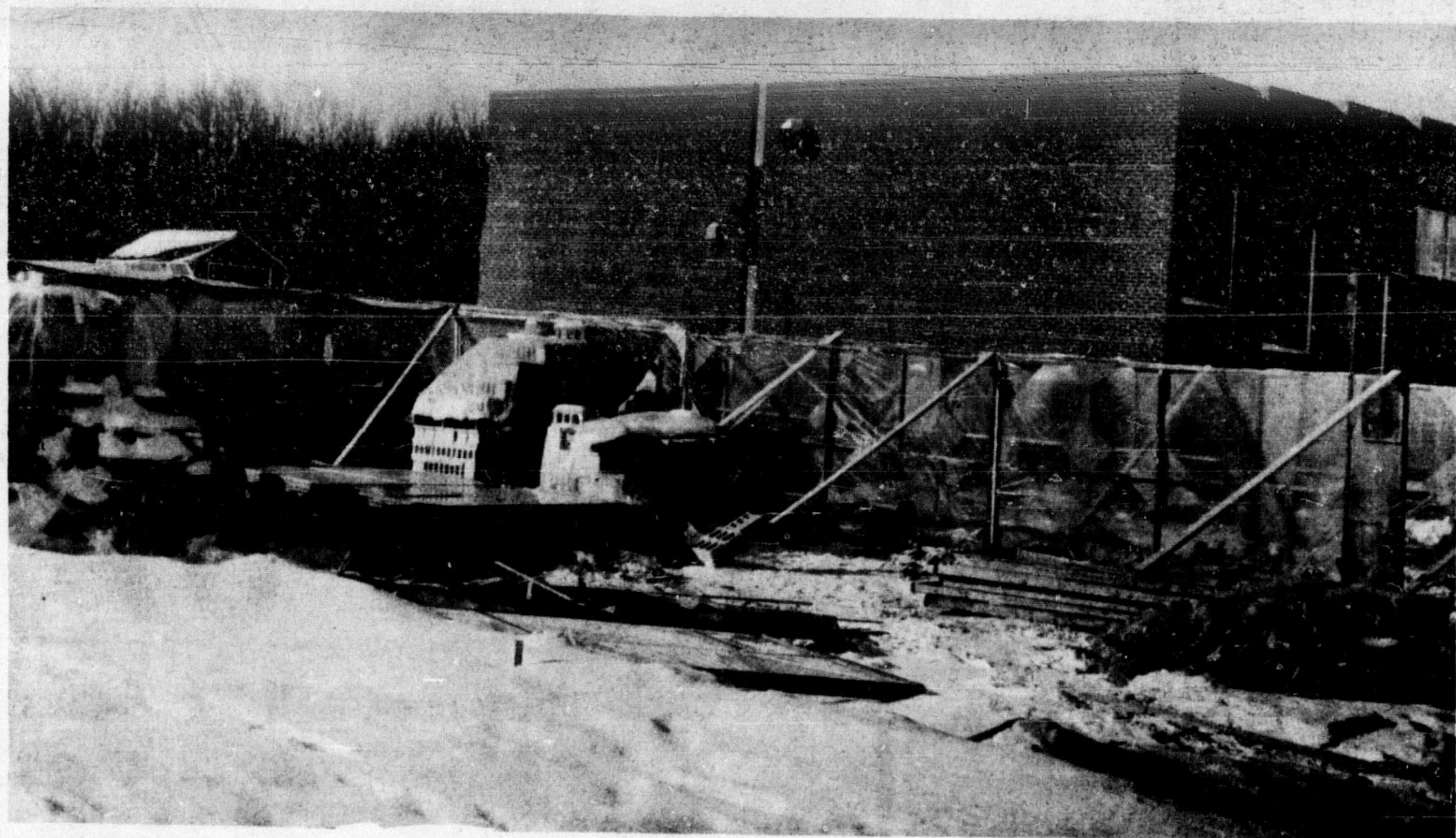


# Winter construction projects underway



**CONSTRUCTION IS FORGING AHEAD** through the winter months on three local projects. Milton District High School's conversion to a full composite program involves an extensive (\$1,500,000) addition to the school, which is underway by the Stewart-Hinan Corporation from St. Catharines. This photo shows the work in progress, while in the second photo four of the contractors talk over the plans, Stan Stankiewicz, foreman Werner Koreck, Stewart-Hinan superintendent Cole Barber and masonry contractor John Pries. Below is the new \$100,000 church being erected in front of the present church on Commercial St. by the congregation of Emmanuel Baptist

Church. Workmen are still laying blocks for the walls in preparation for further work to come. The bottom photo shows a portion of Supersweet Feeds, a division of Robin Hood Flour Mills, which is adding 2,800 square feet of warehousing, replacing some mechanical facilities, installing four finished product storing tanks and new grain handling facilities, and will soon erect a men's locker room and lunchroom. "Several changes are being made in our grain handling facilities, designed to reduce dust both inside and outside the buildings, to speed truck loading and reduce truck noise on the property," Supersweet manager J. 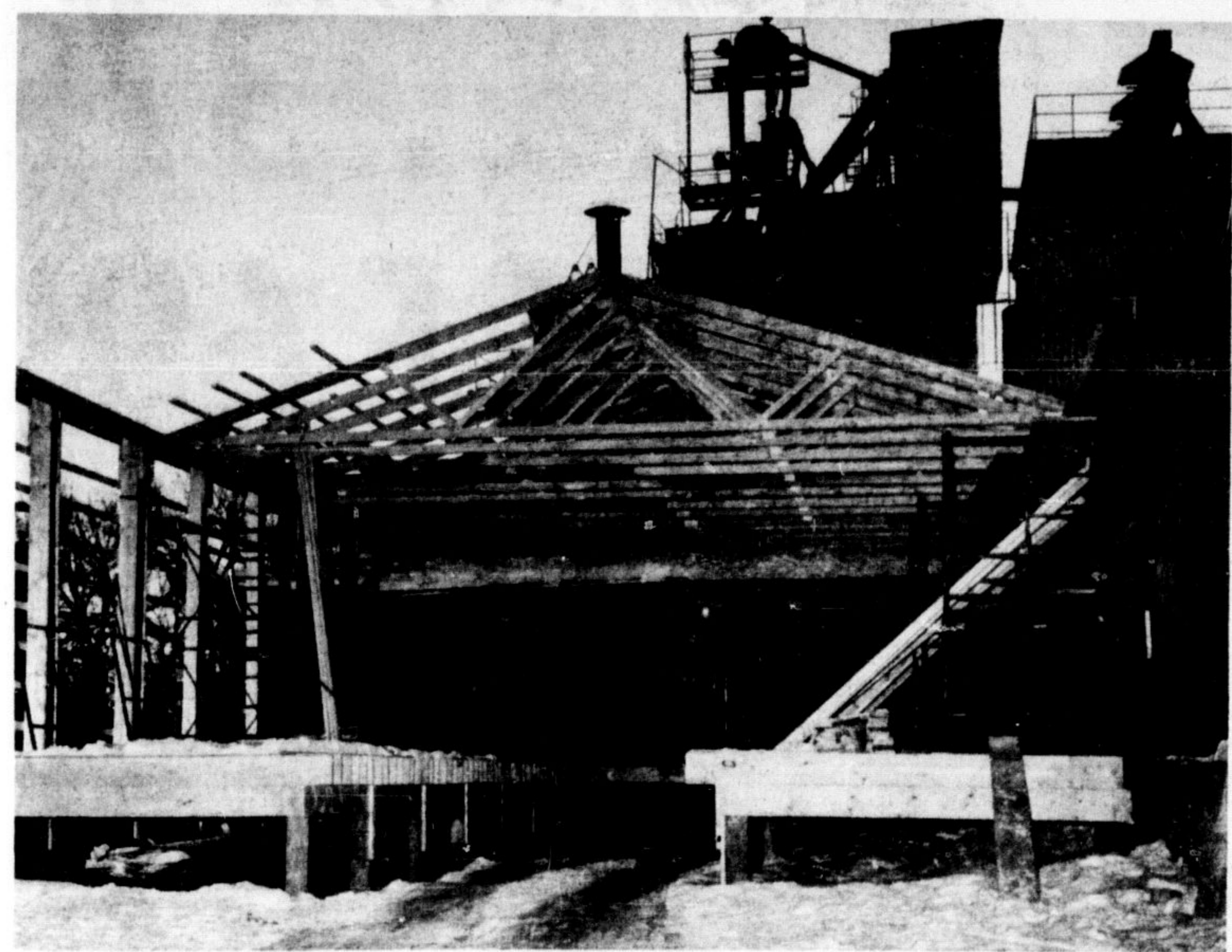
