## Town experts draft guidelines plan takeover of annexed land

The town's counsel in engineering, law, planning and finance drew guidelines Monday on work to be completed prior to the end of the year and in the future to handle the land recently granted by annexation.

Milton Council assembled its engineer, solicitor, municipal planner and auditor in a meeting between council, planning board and municipal officials.

"What should the town do now?" Mayor B. Best asked the experts as they reviewed areas in their interested needing attention.

The solicitor D. A. McConechie recommended:

\* Application to the Ontario Municipal Board for an interim order transferring zoning jurisdiction in the annexed area to Milton. Council later authorized this action by resolution.

\* The boundaries for the area to be annexed be to the east side of the Third Line road allowance and to the South side of the Derry Rd. road allowance. This would place the roads inside the town for police and maintenance jurisdictions.

\* Suggested it would not be practical in the formal order to arrange for an election this year when one is not scheduled except for the board of education.

\* Emphasized the need for a survey of the new boundaries complete with monumenting at an estimated cost of \$4,000. He suggested it would lead to trouble in the future if it was not done now. Council by resolution authorized the work to proceed.

Auditor H. A. Leaver pointed out council was applying in the formal annexation order for definition of an unserviced area in which the mill rate charged could be reduced if such services as garbage collection, sewer service and street lights were not provided. A rough calculation indicated these costs were equivalent to about nine mills but he noted part of the lands annexed did have sewers. He suggested a distinction was necessary on the areas to which specific services were not available.

He also recommended a study of the rate for the unserviced areas should be made and a plan for the staging of services so projections of debentures planned can be developed.

Planner Derek Little suggested severances of properties in the annexed area should not be granted other than by plan of subdivision and the town should adopt a policy not to extend any services beyond its own boundaries.

He also recommended: \* Passing immediately a zoning by-law covering all the lands annexed, putting it in a development or holding zone, to prevent undesirable development.

\* Amendments to the official plan to include the annexed area and a review of the present policies in view of the larger area. A staging plan should be incorporated to guide the development of other services.

\* The new zoning by-law be applied to the annexation area and at that time the existing zoning by-law be reviewed with

gested they should be obtained as soon as possible so detailed study on capital costs can be established before the first of the year.

\* A review of procedures on handling development proposals such as the subdivision agreement and close liaison between the planners and council.

### Carnival opens today Miss Milton postponed

This town should be overwhelmed with festivities during the next few days. The Chamber of Commerce carnival being held in Martin's Flats beginning today through Saturday, coupled with the town's annexation celebration on the weekend, is expected to keep people hopping and bring an atmosphere of joviality to the town.

Ross Brancier looked out of his Main Street Shop Monday and expressed some fear that rain could dampen the carnny which is planned for outside. "Weather permitting, the carnny should be a grand success though," Brancier said.

A food stand will be set up to serve hot dogs, sandwiches, pop,

taffy apples and all those foods popular at carnivals.

A total of seven rides will be set up with some side booths. The ferris wheel is among the rides available. Mr. Brancier said he expected things to get rolling about noon today (Wednesday) and run through to 11 or 11:30 p.m. each night.

"Go Milton Go" straw hats will be on sale for \$1.50 as an added feature. There will be street dancing Saturday and a dance in the arena Friday to celebrate annexation.

Due to the time factor, the Miss Milton contest has been postponed until the fall and will be worked in conjunction with Steam-Era or Fall Fair.

### Pool opens Saturday

What is described as "a very active program" by pool manager Niall Straw is planned for Milton Community Swimming Pool this summer.

Opening Saturday, the pool will again offer swimming lessons at \$3 for pre-beginners and beginners, \$3.50 for juniors and \$4 for intermediate and senior pupils.

Splash parties featuring local talent and open to all youths 13 and over will be held throughout the season, and a Gala Night will be staged late in August with races and games for all ages.

Public swimming will be available each day from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m., opening again each evening from 6 p.m. to 9 p.m. This will cost children 15 cents and adults 25 cents.
