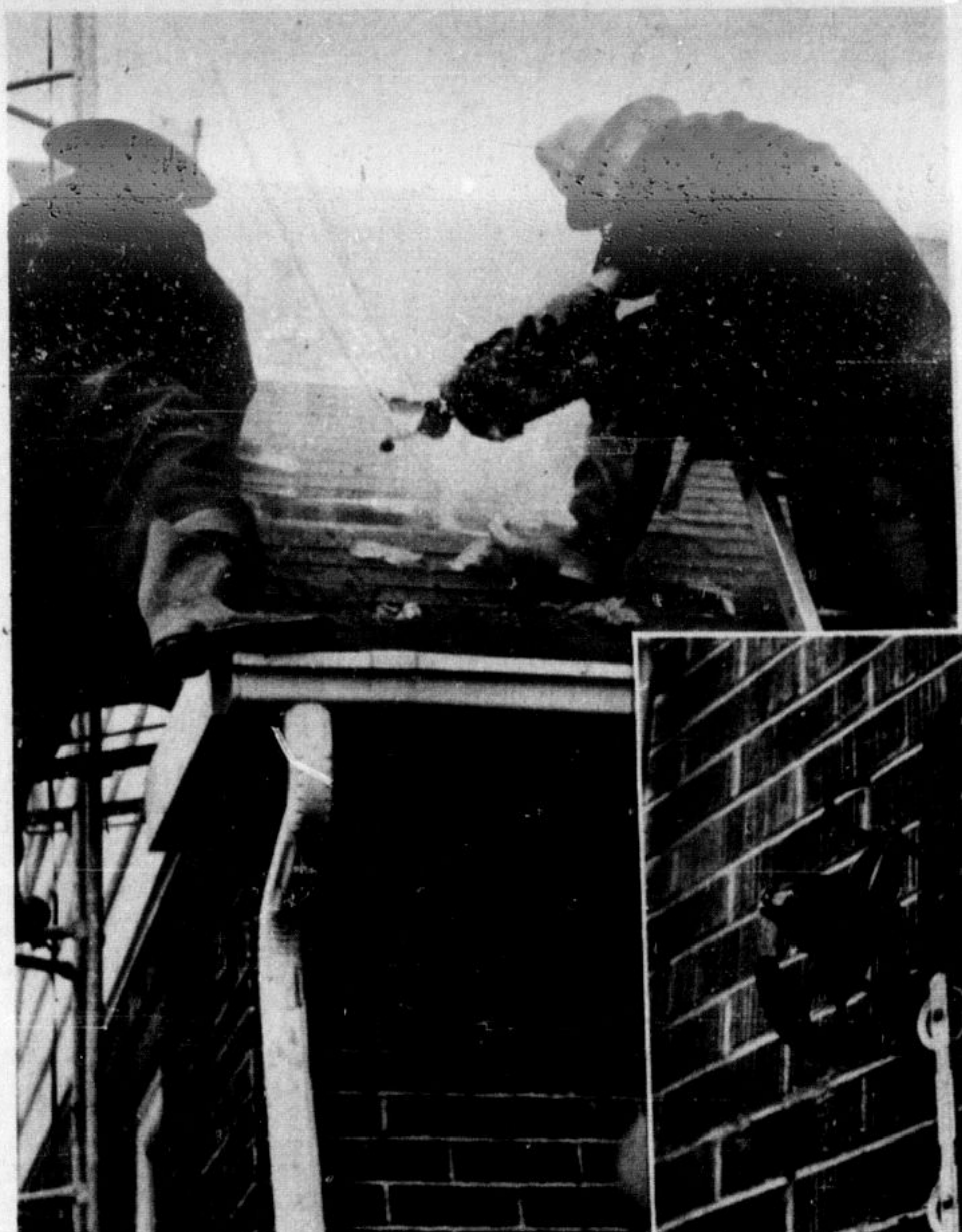

Lightning strikes, causes house fire

In a brief electrical storm Wednesday one house and a large tree were hit in the Milton area.

A bolt of lightning hit a 25 foot clothes line pole at the home of Mr. and Mrs. J. Scott on Main St. W., travelled 80 feet along the plastic coated metal line and penetrated the brick wall at the point the metal bracket was bolted on to the wall.

Sitting in the kitchen of the house Mrs. Scott reported the bolt blew open the doors of the kitchen cupboards, smashed the dishes and started burning.

Firemen called to the scene had to break through a section of roof to get at the fire that was sending clouds of smoke out under the shingles by that time.

A television tower, at almost the same corner of the house that was hit, was untouched but electrical wall plugs inside the house were blown out.

A huge pine tree in the Milton Evergreen Cemetery was completely topped by another bolt of lightning that hit during the same storm. The tree was in the undeveloped area of the cemetery property.

Milton area fire fighters extinguished a fire on a loaded hay wagon at 2:30 a.m., Wednesday morning at the farm of Lee Wilk-

OUR READERS WRITE:

STILL UPSET WITH COMMITTEE

Dear Sir:

As a follow-up to my last letter, I would like to make further observations and express our deepest dismay concerning the administrations of our Township of Nassagaweya to which we held our council responsible for hiring these people to their positions!

I would like to begin by stating that on July 13, 1968, we finally received the long waited for official statement from the Committee of Adjustment (from the meeting of June 20th) informing us that our application was denied and that we may file an appeal to the Ontario Municipal Board by July 22. This proves how negligent, irresponsible and inefficient the administration is, for the expiry date of our offer to purchase was set for June 30. That very important fact, the Committee of Adjustment, conveniently saw to overlook, for this delay of official reply and recommendation of appeal, enabled us to extend the expiry date on the offer to purchase. For this we are, as a result, feeling a great financial burden and business discomfort! This type of justice should not be permitted and practised in a country with a democratic setup! This is just one of the many reasons we are suggesting to the council to replace the members of the present committee with people who will be mature enough to be flexible and openminded to help not hinder, yet be within the boundaries of planning.

By the way, we have found to our greatest dismay, that the chairman of the Committee of Adjustment conveniently occupies the position of Chairman of the Planning Board!

The second point I would like to bring to the editor's attention is how damaging and costly the lack of efficiency the administrative personnel exercise toward the average ratepayer, fee payers, etc. For example, on calling the Township in order to

inquire about reapplication of separation, we were told that we should file an application accompanied with a twenty-five dollar fee and survey of the land and file all of this; nobody says anything, the clerk, or the typist, or the secretary-treasurer; your application is denied and you sit in dismay, shock and worry about the money wasted on surveys, which actually were

not needed for it was the responsibility of the above mentioned people to inform us of the proper requirements to that application. FOR THE FACT IS THAT AN ACTUAL SURVEY IS NOT REQUIRED UNTIL AN APPROVAL OF SEPARATION FROM THE COMMITTEE OF ADJUSTMENT HAS BEEN GRANTED!! All that is needed is a sketch! We've been in contact with these same people in the process of filing our application, yet not one of them felt responsible enough to inform us of these rights.

We for one, feel we should not contribute through fees and taxes to salaries to the above mentioned people! Therefore, we would find it being in the right by asking the reeve, deputy reeve, and the other members of the council to be reimbursed for the money we spent, due to the negligence of these three above mentioned staff for survey!!
